Thank you for your letter dated 27th August, 1981 and for the observations of your Inspectors.

I would like to make the following comments in response.

- 1. Although the U.K. coins returned to you may have had the same defects as the Jersey coins on close inspection this does not seem to be apparent to members of the public.
- 2. I would therefore draw the conclusion that any defects are more apparent in the nickel silver coins of this size than cupro-nickel coins.
- 3. Assuming that my conclusion is correct I suggest that more advice from the Royal Mint would have been appreciated before committing ourselves to the nickel silver coin.
- 4. Any coins put in presentation boxes or cases were handled by Treasury staff wearing gloves. The coins may have been handled after rejection without gloves, but we were not complaining about fingerprints.
- 5. We were not aware that the United Kingdom were distributing uncirculated coins of a higher standard for presentation purposes, had we known that this was a possibility we would have considered it.
- 6. 'I repeat that in respect of previous cupro-nickel issues we had no complaints from the public.

I understand from my Chief Cashier that he is holding about 2,000 coins which have either been returned by members of the public or rejected as unfit for circulation by banks or ourselves.

I suggest that nearer the end of the issue we shall return these coins to you together with any others that may be rejected in order that you may give us credit for them.

In the meantime I would be grateful for your response to my comments 3 and 5 above.

#### Jersey Royal Wedding Coins

We have been extremely concerned about the quality of the Jersey £2 nickel silver coin. We have received numerous complaints from members of the public both in regard to the condition of coins that we have packed in presentation cases and also about the condition of coins issued loose from stock. I appreciate that the coins are not proofs but we have always previously been impressed by the quality of the uncirculated coins from the Royal Mint and indeed we have had no complaints about previous Crown issues.

What I am afraid will happen is that the media will get hold of a story which will not do the excellent reputation of the Royal Mint any good. I have given instructions that any coin not in a suitable condition will not be circulated for the time being, pending an investigation by yourselves. Rather than circulate the worst of the coins I propose that they should be returned to you.

I enclose a sample of 10 of these coins which have been taken at random as uncirculated from rouleaux. They are representative of the condition of up to half of the coins we now hold in stock. I suggest that your production people should investigate the matter and report back. I also enclose three U.K. Crowns which have been circulating in the Island and you will see that they are in very much better condition than our uncirculated coins.

#### ROYAL WEDDING COINS

Thank you for your letter of 20th August 1981 regarding your concern on the standard of the Royal Wedding nickel silver coins.

The ten sample coins which you submitted have been passed to our Inspectors together with the United Kingdom coins you also returned. The observations I have received from the Inspectors are as follows:-

- 1) The ten samples were well struck ordinary standard coins with typical surface damage which would be expected from the bulk production processes from such a heavy coin. The same defects are evident on the U.K. coins submitted.
- 2) The coins show extensive finger marking and as we would normally have bulk handling processes, it is unlikely that a high proportion of coins could have finger prints from handling within the Royal Mint. The only handling process involved in ordinary coin production is the inspection area where because of the necessity to handle coins constantly throughout the day, the operators wear gloves for their own protection. The finger marks on your coins were easily removed by wiping with a cloth.
- Normal sampling processes do allow for a small number of coins with defects to escape detection. For this reason a few coins with a defective stain or a chip could be passed to a customer in ordinary standard coin. Naturally this would not happen with uncirculated standard or proof standard because these are individually handled and any such defect would be sorted out immediately.



Cont'd....

The coins you received and returned to us are typical of ordinary standard coin produced in bulk. They are not intended as commemorative coinage for presentation purposes, but only as a general issue through a Bank for hypothetical circulation. If a coin is being used for special presentation purposes, then it would be normal to strike it in a higher standard. For this reason the United Kingdom struck not only the general issue cupro-nickel coins but also the uncirculated cupro-nickel coin which sold at £1.95. The coin which circulates at 25 pence and which in practice matches your coin which circulates at £2 cannot possibly be produced to a standard which would make it suitable for presentation purposes within the face value. In the case of Jersey coins, obviously with a £2 face value any future issue could be produced within the face value in uncirculated standard, and used for presentation purposes. The likely cost would be about £1 per coin. While the coin is produced as ordinary standard at a cost of 20 pence each, one has to accept that it will be typical of large heavy coins being tossed around during production processes suffering all the resultant damage.

If after further inspection of some of your coins and comparison with some United Kingdom coins you still feel there is some reason for complaint, please do not hesitate to send me any further samples you wish and I will have them inspected. As I have already said, due to the bulk production techniques, it is possible for a small proportion of genuinely damaged coins to escape detection and naturally we would replace any of these if you required. However, the majority of the coin delivered should be typical of the sample we received which is a normal standard ORDINARY STANDARD COIN.

Apparently 50% of their stock are similar to the assortment of coins enclosed. Can you please advise:

- 1) Are the coins damaged to any greater extent than the U.K. coins?
- 2) Could the finger marks which are obvious on the coins have been put there by the Royal Mint?
- 3) Would the difference in alloy account for any of the problems they seem to be experiencing?

I would be grateful for any other observations which may help my reply to Jersey.

### COMMEMORATIVE COINS

Further to our discussions on the marketing of your commemorative coins, I thought I should put on record that the position we both agreed should apply to the Royal Wedding coins and any other coins the Royal Mint is marketing on behalf of the States Treasury.

The coins are supplied at manufacturing plus any bullion for distribution in Jersey. The price you charge is the basic cost for any of the coins on the export market, that is exclusive of any United Kingdom tax. Naturally if you supply to your Banks or to any local dealers, we assume you would encourage them by offering a discount, but again request that they do not undercut the price, either on the Island or on the international market.

The Royal Mint has exclusive rights to market in all other areas of the World, and as such we will prepare and distribute promotional literature to our mailing lists, both in the United Kingdom and in America and through our dealers and agents throughout the World. As you are aware, this is a rather expensive exercise involving the Mint in committing itself to tens of thousands of pounds on promotion in anticipation that this expenditure will be recovered through coin sales. If you receive any enquiries from outside the States of Jersey, then I would request that you refer the dealers or customers to the Royal Mint in order that we can direct them to the appropriate agent, or add them to our own mailing list. Naturally one does not expect that a rigid adherence to this policy is maintained in the odd exceptional case where you get a request, particularly where it is from a relative of someone in Jersey or from a former resident requesting that you send them one or perhaps two coins. We are only really talking about the regular issue of coins off the Island which we would hope would be covered by Royal Mint sales through our dealers and agents in order that the income derived helps to offset the amount we have spent on promotion.



As you are aware, we have been advised by Spinks that they have received a circular advising them of the availability of coins direct from the States Treasury. They have drawn our attention to the fact that in some instances the discounts being quoted by the Treasury are more favourable than those quoted by the Royal Mint. As we have not seen the reported circular, we cannot honestly compare and can only take the word of the Spink's representative. However, I hope that should Spinks or anyone else approach you direct, you refer them to the Royal Mint for their supplies since the prices being offered on the Island will obviously be more attractive because of the difference in prices due to V.A.T. It is probable that the difference will not be as great as it appears since V.A.T. may be payable on the re-imported goods

Should the basis of this agreement not be acceptable to you in some respect, I would be grateful for your early comments.







Confirming my cable, we have purchased bullion at £227.941 per troy ounce for the 1,000 coins you require. The total costs are as follows:-

Total cost of bullion £107,353.74

Brokerage charge £ 268.38

Total sum due: £107,622.12

I would be grateful if you could arrange for the amount outstanding to be transferred, if you have not already done so, in accordance with my telex.

I confirm my discussion with Ian Monin regarding the price to be charged in the United Kingdom. As we have to pay VAT on the bullion when we purchase it, if the coins remain in the United Kingdom the total cost in the United Kingdom for each coin will be £250. This will allow for the recovery of all costs and show a profit of £50 for each coin as a royalty for the Treasury. As the VAT paid on the bullion transaction is recoverable on any coins sent to Jersey, you do not have to pay this sum and it has not been included in the calculations shown above. I would therefore suggest that if you wish to allow a lower price to be charged in Jersey, you charge £235 which takes account of the difference in the price due to VAT being paid on the bullion transaction in the United Kingdom. I feel we can justify any comments made to the Royal Mint about the discrepancy in the price between Jersey and the United Kingdom on the basis of the £16 approximately VAT which we have to pay on the bullion transaction for U.K. coins.

### 1981 COIN SET

This new "Year Type" set is issued in the Bicentenary year of the Battle of Jersey and therefore incorporates the one pound commemorative currency coin making a total of seven coins.

It is now ten years since the decimalisation of Jersey's currency took place and it is an appropriate time to drop the description of 'New' penny. It will be seen that these decimal coins are described simply as penny or pence for the first time and that this has allowed the reverse of the coins to be redesigned so that the arms of Jersey divide the date as they did before decimalisation. The result is a simplified reverse in keeping with the obverse bearing the effigy of H.M. The Queen designed by Arnold Machine, O.B.E.? R.A.

#### THE CURRENCY OF JERSEY

All types of coins have been used in Jersey in past eras. French coins circulated with those of England and other countries until the States of Jersey issued its own coinage of 1/52,1/26 and 1/13 of a shilling in 1841. In 1877 coinage regorm changed the Jersey coin denominations into 1/48,1/24 and 1/12 of a shilling and until decimalisation the Jersey threepenny piece was described as a 4 of a shilling.

During the German Occupation of the Island the States of Jersey issued banknotes for 6d, 1/-, 2/-, 10/- and £1 which circulated alongside the Reichmarks. Jersey banknotes today are in denominations of £1, £5, £10 and £20 whilst the Island's coinage consists of ½p, 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p, 50p and £1 pieces.

The States of Jersey are proud to celebrate the wedding of H.R.H. The Prince of Wales and Lady Diana Spencer with the issue of a 22 commemorative coin.

The Channel Islands have belonged to the English Crown since the days of William the Conqueror who ruled over them as part of his Duchy of Normandy. From the time of Queen Victoria Jersey, the largest of the Channel Islands, has had a nunismatic history of commemorating Royal events. The States of Jersey have presented medallions to local school children to park Royal visits and coronations and these are prized pessessions of many local families. It is fitting that thes Royal occasion should be similarly recorded by the issue of a legal tender coin.

#### THE DESIGN

The effigy of Her Majesty on the obverse of the Royal Wedding two pound coin is the work of Arnold Machin, O.B.E., R.A. The denomination of two pounds appears on this side forming a complete circle with the rest of the legend - Queen Eliabeth II. Bailiwick of Jersey.

The reverse design is by Michael Rizello. O.B.E., the President of the Society of Portrait Sculptors. Jersey has been very fortunate in obtaining his services because of his unique experience for the occasion. He designed the portrait of Prince Charles which appeared on the 1980 Fiji 10 dollar coin and was responsible for

the Earl Mountbatten of Burma series which was issued by the Turks and Caicos Islands as well as the Kings of England collection struck for the Cayman Islands. His excellent portraiture and simplicity of design are most appropriate.

The 22 carst gold frosted proof is smaller and is in fact exactly similar in size and weight to the gold £2 coin issued by the United Kingdom and therefore the nost appropriate specification for this denomination.

#### JERSEY AND THE ROYAL MINT

Jersey coins have been struck by the Royal Mint ever since 1813 when silver tokens for three shillings and eighteen peace were issued by the States of Jersey. because of a shortage of silver coins. In 1877, due to pressur of work, the Royal Kint subcontracted the coin issue for that year to R. Heaton and Son, Rirmingham although the Royal Mint remained responsible for preparing the dies. The only other occasion when a different mint was used was in 1972 for the silver wedding series which was struck by Italianshio, C.A. The York MINT, BIRMINGHAM.

Jersey was one of the first territories outside of the United Kingdom to have its coins struck at the Royal Mint. It is fitting that the tradition should continue on this Royal cocasion.



Memorandum on the sale of gold commemorative coins for the Royal Wedding

# <u>Specifications</u>

It is our intention to issue a small number of 22 carat gold coins commemorating the Royal Wedding. The specification of all coins will be as follows:-

Composition 916.6 gold Diameter 28.40 mm Weight 15.98 grms Edge Milled Shape

#### 2. Face Value

We suggest that a legal tender coin of face value  $\pm 2$ should be used for the gold coin.

# 3. Minting Limits

We would recommend that you issue a limited edition of 1,000 gold proof coins and 500 uncirculated coins.

#### 4. Costs

Based on current prices the F.O.B. cost per coin would be as follows:-

Gold Proof Coin £18.00 including case Gold Unc Coin £ 6.50 "

#### 5. Bullion

Bullion would be additional at cost and we would require that bullion for coins being taken for distribution by the Authority was pre-paid at the time of purchase. The Royal Mint would finance the bullion for all coins being marketed.

# 6. Packaging

The gold proof coin will be packed in a leather covered case and the uncirculated gold coin will be packed in a vinyl covered metal frame case.

#### 7. Royalties

The Royal Mint would pay the following royalties for each coin sold on your behalf:-

Gold Proof Coin £50 Gold Unc Coin

# Design and Master Tool Charges

Should a new model be required for the coin, the cost per model would be £750. The cost of master tools would be £1,250 per The cost of models and master tools would be deducted from the income from the marketed sales.

# 1. Specifications

It is our intention to issue a series of sterling silver proof crowns for a number of territories and in addition a base metal coin for ordinary circulation. Each crown will show the Machin effigy of Her Majesty The Queen on the obverse with the reverse to be chosen by the territory involved. The specifications of the coins will be as follows:-

<u>Item</u>	Ordinary Standard	Proof Standard
Composition	Cupro-Nickel	925 silver
Diameter	38.61 mm	38.61 mm
Weight	28.28 grms	28.28 grms
Edge	Milled	Coarse Milled

Where territories use a different alloy for the higher denomination, their existing alloy may be used for the circulating version of the coin.

### 2. Face Value

We suggest that a legal tender coin of face value £2 should be used for the ordinary circulation coin and also the silver proof version.

# 3. Minting Limits

We would recommend that you place a limit of 25,000 on the silver proof coin but that no limit be set for the base metal coin. It is expected that 40 - 50,000 base metal coins would be required by dealers. The quantity to be struck would be determined by the quantity required for local demand and to satisfy the demands of the dealers worldwide.

# 4. Costs

Based on current prices, the F.O.B. price per coin would be as follows:-

Silver Proof	Coin		£4.75
Cunro-nickel		coin	£0.20

### 5. Bullion

Bullion would be additional at cost and we would require that bullion for coins being taken for distribution by the Authority be pre-paid at the time of purchase. The Royal Mint would finance the bullion for all coins being marketed.

### 6. Packaging

The costs include packing of the silver coin in individual cases or in capsules in a collector's set where the collector chooses to buy all coins in the series. The ordinary standard coins will be packed either in paper rolls or in small plastic packs containing 20 or 25 coins.

# 7. Royalties

For the proof coin, the Royal Mint will pay a royalty of £5 for each coin sold. For the ordinary coins sold in bulk to dealers, we would pay the difference between the cost of manufacture and the face value.

# 8. Model and Master tool charges

The cost for producing a reverse model will be approximately £750. The cost of master tools for each denomination will be £1,250 per side. Should an existing obverse tool at crown size be available, which is suitable for the proposed Royal Wedding coin, there will be no charge for the obverse tool. However, if a suitable obverse is not in existence, the cost of master tools will be £2,500. The same tools would be used for both the base metal and the silver proof coin. The costs of models and master tools will be deducted from the income from marketed sales.

However, Mr. Monins felt that we should be aware that a motion to give the business to another mint was only narrowly defeated. He interpreted the mood as being a last chance and urged us to ensure that there were no slip-ups with the Royal Wedding Crown.

Dear John.

This confirms today's telephone call saying that the Finance and Economic Committee have authorised the issue of a crown sized commemorative coin to mark the Wedding of Prince Charles to be struck in nickel silver, subject to legislation which is in train, with a legal tender denomination of £2. This will be accompanied by a limited issue of sterling silver proofs and, possibly, gold proofs in a reduced size.

Ordinary Coinage. Robin Harris has passed a copy of your letter dated 6th March 1981 to me. One point which puzzles us is the cost of master tool redating that you mention. I believe that the master tools, which drop the 'New' description of penny, were to be dated 1981. The question of redating only occurred when, due to local banks having imported U.K. coins in the summer of 1980 because of the delay in the arrival of our 1980 coins, it was under consideration that the 1981 issues be postponed for 12 months which would have meant redating to 1982. Perhaps you would clarify.

1981 Base Metal Proof Coin Sets. Your point about the inclusion of a base metal proof of the 1981 Wedding £2 is appreciated and the suggestion that it should be included in the 1981 base metal proof set withdrawn. The priority must be that the set should

# ORDINARY COINAGE

With reference to discussions with Mr. Monin on the production of a small quantity of Jersey circulation coins dated 1981, I have pleasure in presenting the following offer.

# <u>Specifications</u>

It is assumed that these are to be identical in content, size and weight to the existing coins.

# Designs

The designs will be the same as the existing coins except that the word "new" is omitted and that the date is altered to 1981.

# <u>Prices</u>

The F.O.B. cost per 1,000 will be as follows:-

## Master Tools

It is assumed that you would wish the cost of the master tools to be offset against the income from sales of a base metal proof set for 1981. The cost of the master tool re-dating will be £650 per denomination as advised in my letter of 9th September 1980.

## Delivery

As the tools are already available, we could delivery coins and sets within three months of confirmation of your order.

# Royal Wedding Crown

Mr. Monin has advised that you are considering the possibility of having a nickel silver crown size piece of £2 denomination with a sterling silver proof edition, and that you may also incorporate the base metal proof coin in any 1981 base metal There is no objection to the nickel silver coin being issued rather than a cupro-nickel coin, the only requirement being that to be included in the series there must be a sterling silver proof edition. However, should you wish the coin to be incorporated in a 1981 base metal set, it would mean that the 1981 set could not be available in time for the early Summer tourist trade. It is unlikely that we would have the tools completed in time to strike before the end of June or early July. This would obviously mean that the sets would clash with the launching of the full series of Royal Wedding crowns. We would also have missed the Royal Mint 'Coins of the World' mailing in June and we could not therefore promote the set in our mailing series until September or October. should perhaps take this into account when considering the 1981 base metal set and the Royal Wedding crown.

# Artist, Mr. Michael Rizzello O.B.E.



I regret it will not be possible to have preliminary sketches available prior to your Finance Meeting on Wednesday. However, Mr. Rizzello can rightly be described as one of the foremost coin and medal artists in the World. He has recently completed the designsfor the Turks & Caicos Earl Mountbatten series, the Cayman Islands Kings of England series and the Turks & Caicos Prince Charles commemorative coin. He is President of the Royal Society of British Sculptors and has also headed the Society of Portrait Sculptors. For your information I enclose two brochures illustrating the coinage which we have recently had the privilege of marketing and which was designed by Mr. Rizzello.
