I understand that you require official confirmation of the 1981 Jersey coinage order.

We agree to the proposals set forth in your letter of 6th March 1981 that the specifications be identical in content, size and weight to the existing coins and that the designs will be the same save that the word 'new' shall be omitted and the date changed to 1981. The cost of the redating of the master tools will be £650 per denomination and will be offset against the sales of a 1981 base metal proof set.

Thank you for your letter of 11th March 1981 regarding the coinage of Jersey. By now you should be in possession of the sketch supplied by Mr. Rizzello on the proposed design for the Royal Wedding crown. I would be grateful for your comments as soon as possible.

Ordinary Coinage

The master tools for the 1981 coinage have been prepared with the date 1981 and the word "new" deleted. We have treated the amendment as a re-date rather than a re-tooling as there is little difference in the work required from the re-dating to the dropping of the word "new". To-date no invoice has been raised for the production of the tools for 1981 which is why I raised the issue in my letters on the new coinage.

1981 Base Metal Set

Providing you confirm before the end of March your requirement for a 1981 base metal set, we will market the set in our 'Coins of the World' issue in June. However, in view of the time factor involved, it is essential that your reply is received otherwise it will not be possible to meet the target date of the beginning of June.

1981 Gold £1 Coin

I confirm our discussions regarding the 1981 gold £1 coin. Should you require further quantities of these coins, they will be charged at bullion plus manufacture plus interest on the bullion to 31st December 1980. Please advise me of any additional quantities you require of these coins. I regret it will not be possible to supply any more silver coins.

This confirms today's telephone call saying that the Finance and Economic Committee have authorised the issue of a crown sized commemorative coin to mark the Wedding of Prince Charles to be struck in nickel silver, subject to legislation which is in train, with a legal tender denomination of £2. This will be accompanied by a limited issue of sterling silver proofs and, possibly, gold proofs in a reduced size.

Ordinary Coinage. Robin Harris has passed a copy of your letter dated 6th March 1981 to me. One point which puzzles us is the cost of master tool redating that you mention. I believe that the master tools, which drop the 'New' description of penny, were to be dated 1981. The question of redating only occurred when, due to local banks having imported U.K. coins in the summer of 1980 because of the delay in the arrival of our 1980 coins, it was under consideration that the 1981 issues be postponed for 12 months which would have meant redating to 1982. Perhaps you would clarify.

1981 Base Metal Proof Coin Sets. Your point about the inclusion of a base metal proof of the 1981 Wedding £2 is appreciated and the suggestion that it should be included in the 1981 base metal proof set withdrawn. The priority must be that the set should

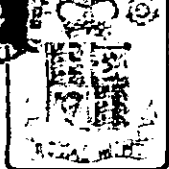

Specifications

Delivery

As the tools are already available, we could delivery coins and sets within three months of confirmation of your order.

Royal Wedding Crown

Mr. Monin has advised that you are considering the possibility of having a nickel silver crown size piece of £2 denomination with a sterling silver proof edition, and that you may also incorporate the base metal proof coin in any 1981 base metal set. There is no objection to the nickel silver coin being issued rather than a cupro-nickel coin, the only requirement being that to be included in the series there must be a sterling silver proof edition. However, should you wish the coin to be incorporated in a 1981 base metal set, it would mean that the 1981 set could not be available in time for the early Summer tourist trade. It is unlikely that we would have the tools completed in time to strike before the end of June or early July. This would obviously mean that the sets would clash with the launching of the full series of Royal Wedding crowns. We would also have missed the Royal Mint 'Coins of the World' mailing in June and we could not therefore promote the set in our mailing series until September or October. You should perhaps take this into account when considering the 1981 base metal set and the Royal Wedding crown.

Artist, Mr. Michael Rizzello O.B.E.

I have commissioned the artist, Mr. Michael Rizzello, to prepare preliminary designs for your Royal Wedding crown. I regret it will not be possible to have preliminary sketches available prior to your Finance Meeting on Wednesday. However, Mr. Rizzello can rightly be described as one of the foremost coin and medal artists in the World. He has recently completed the designs for the Turks & Caicos Earl Mountbatten series, the Cayman Islands Kings of England series and the Turks & Caicos Prince Charles commemorative coin. He is President of the Royal Society of British Sculptors and has also headed the Society of Portrait Sculptors. For your information I enclose two brochures illustrating the coinage which we have recently had the privilege of marketing and which was designed by Mr. Rizzello.

Thank you for your letter dated 25th January 1980 and for the final statement on the Silver Jubilee coins. This seems to conclude a highly satisfactory operation, thank you for your assistance.

As regards the designs for the 1981 coins incorporating the numeral as well as the words for the value, the consensus of opinion here is that neither of the designs is completely satisfactory in all respects. In my view the incorporation of a numeral would require a completely new design and that would take too long to agree.

In the circumstances I believe we should return to the design approved by our Committee last year without the numeral. The coins would be dated 1981 and there does not seem to be any reason why you should not go ahead with the production of the new tools in advance of our order.

We would probably want to order in time for delivery in mid 1981. Would you please let me know the latest ordering date for delivery at that time. The size of our order will be contingent upon the remaining stocks of our 1980 coins and the later we leave it the better from that point of view.

In a separate letter to Mr. Lotherington I mentioned that I would be in London on business on the 15th February and that I hoped to call in at your office to meet you and clear up any outstanding matters.

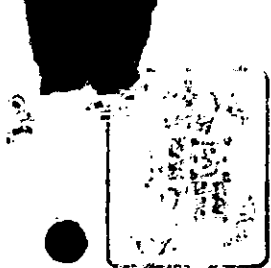

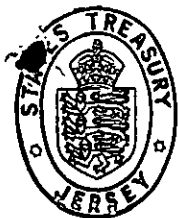



Thank you for your letter dated 10th January 1980. I am sure that the amicable relationship between yourselves and the Jersey Treasury will continue. Thank you for your invitation to visit you in London - I will try to fit this in on the occasion of my next visit.

The amendments to the Decimal Currency (Jersey) Law will, I am afraid, be delayed. Our lawyers have indicated that it takes about seven months for an item to be placed on the Privy Council agenda and we cannot expect to see the amendments through all the due processes until August. The production of the newly designed coins will therefore have to be delayed until 1981.

This causes us problems since my Chief Cashier has indicated that we will run out of present stocks by June. I suggested to Mr. Lotherington, to whom I spoke in your absence, that we should reissue our current design, with the date changed to 1980. The cost of changing the date is, I believe, £3,600. Would you please take this letter as an official request to go ahead with the change. I will let you have a quantity order shortly.

At the same time we would be prepared, subject to a satisfactory marketing proposal and our Committee's approval, to authorise the issue of a quantity of base metal proof sets of the 1980 coins issue. Ideally we would like to obtain the Finance and Economics Committee's approval at its meeting of the 30th January; the agenda for this meeting go out one week ahead and therefore we would need your proposal within the next week.

We now have more time to consider the new issue for 1981; however, I would be pleased to receive as soon as possible the artist's sketches promised in your letter dated 21st November 1979. Hopefully we can decide whether or not to include a

numeral for the value and be able to take delivery of the coins fairly early in 1981.


I look forward to a visit to your office in the near future.

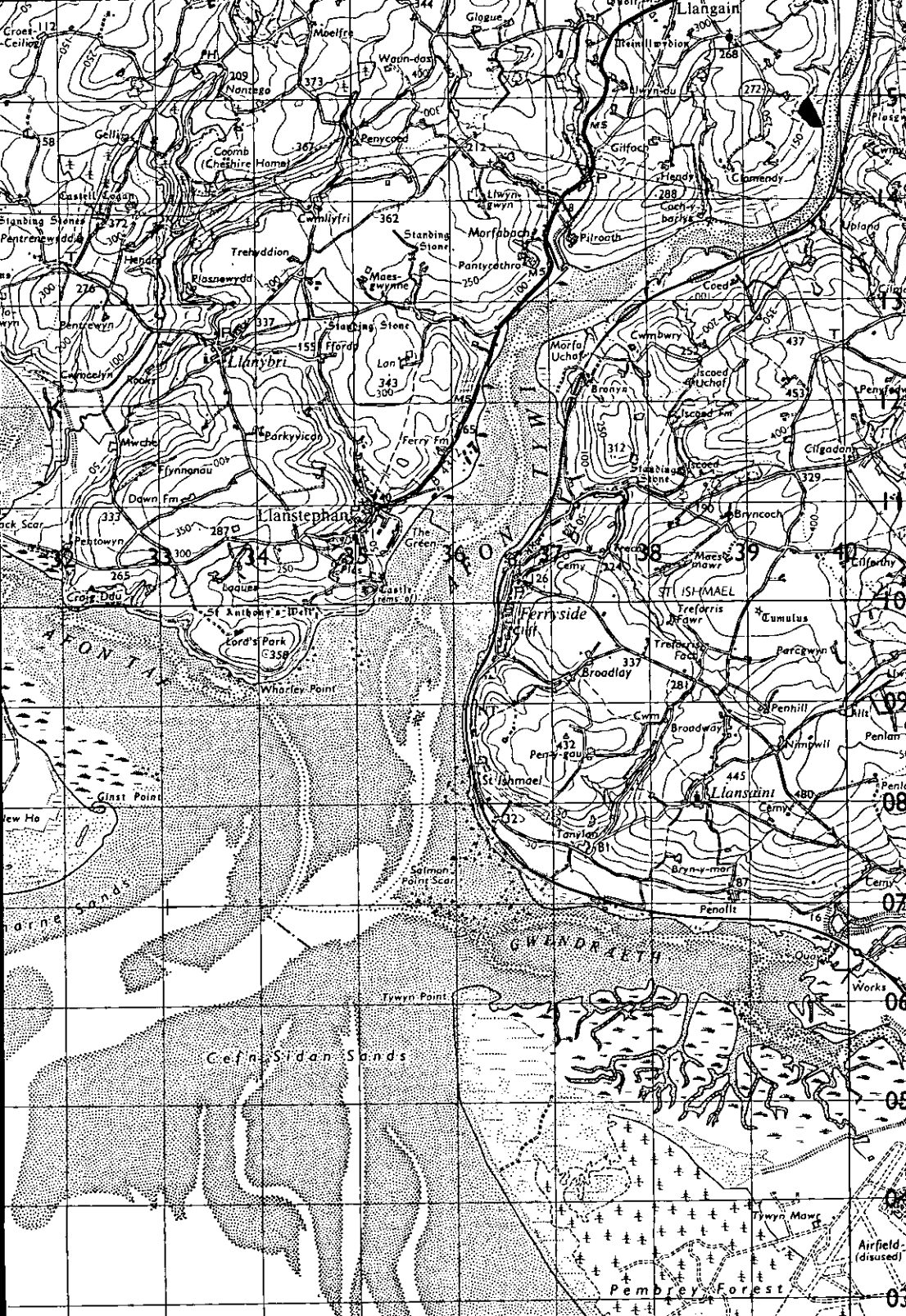

I have delayed replying to your letter of 21st November hoping that I would have firmer information as to the progress of the amendment to the Decimal Currency (Jersey) Law which, being domestic legislation normally passes through Privy Council fairly swiftly. However, to date nothing has come through.

I have every hope, however, that the amendment will be cleared early in 1980 and we shall then be placing an order for some new coinage. My colleague, Mr. R.E. Harris, will be taking over from me, responsibility for Jersey coinage with effect from 1st January and will be in touch with you as soon as we have firm information on the quantity of coinage we wish to have struck.

You mentioned in the last paragraph of your letter the possibility of producing proof sets of the new coinage and I should be grateful if you would prepare a marketing proposal for 10,000 sets. The idea has not yet been put before the Finance and Economics Committee who have, in the past, been very conservative in its approach to numismatic coin issues, but I think it will be worthwhile exploring this avenue in the near future.



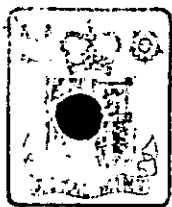

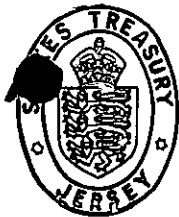

Thank you for your letter of 21st May and your prompt co-operation in assisting with our impending coinage scarcity.

I confirm our order for the quantities stated in your letter and am pleased to note your price for each of the denominations. Payment will be made in accordance with your conditions.

The Chief Cashier has mentioned to me the great convenience that he experienced in 1977 when the Royal Mint supplied coins packed in rouleaux within the packing cases and I wonder if it is possible to arrange for this form of packing again?

Looking slightly ahead to delivery, I note that you will telephone this office to make final arrangements; it would, however, be most convenient if despatch from the Royal Mint could be so arranged that delivery is taken in Jersey on a Monday. Problems arise on other weekdays. 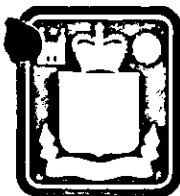
Thank you very much for your recent letters and the samples of the new Jersey coinage. The samples look excellent and we are very pleased with them.

The sketches showing alternative ways of dropping the word "NEW" from the Reverse inscription of Jersey coins, sent to me under cover of your memo dated 27 June were forwarded to the customer.

They have come back indicating that they would prefer to revert to their old practice (possibly 19th century) of having the date split left and right i.e. "19" occupying the space due west of the centre shield and "77" due east.

Could you possibly let me have another sketch this week, before Jersey's Finance Committee meet again on 20 July, showing this alternative lay-out. One denomination would do. The name of the country to appear at the top of the coin as at present and denominational value in words only at the bottom.

Dear Mr. Lee,

Thank you for your letter of 17 June confirming the Treasury order for ordinary circulation coins dated 1977.

Preliminary work has been put in hand but we would like to have your agreement on the manner in which the inscriptions on the Reverses are to be re-arranged due to omission of the word "NEW". Our Chief Engraver has proposed alternative layouts and I enclose rough sketches illustrating the two slightly different ideas.

Basically, we think that closing up the words without "NEW" would leave quite a large naked space east and west between upper and lower inscriptions. The Chief Engraver therefore suggests that the modified layout could be improved if:

- a. the spacing of the upper inscription "BAILIWICK OF JERSEY" is left as it is and dots inserted in the spaces between upper and lower inscriptions (sketches marked "A") or,
- b. spacing of "BAILIWICK OF JERSEY" is spread out more to close up the spaces between the two inscriptions, (sketches marked "B").

Whichever method you decide upon the work content will be roughly the same. We shall have to produce new models and a completely new range of master tools for each denomination. The cost per denomination would be £750 but this includes the redating charge of £425 mentioned in our letter of 18 May.

Please may we have your agreement ~~to~~ this and your advice on preferred layout.
