Further to my message 22 February, the customer has now returned for disposal 53,675 pieces of circulation Royal Wedding coins. As previously mentioned, the coins have a weight of 28.28 grammes and are struck in an alloy of 70% copper, 25% zinc and 5% nickel.

Following discussion of your message dated 22 February, the material was accepted for future use on orders for £1 alloy coins at the rate of 1.05 kilos of material for each one kilo finished coin weight plus an additional charge of £50 for handling and storage.

As the coins are not issued, I propose that they be accepted at standard weight, that is 1.518 tonnes, making 1.442 tonnes available for future orders for £1 coins.

DISPOSAL OF SILVER PROOF COINS

Thank you for your letter dated 17 February confirming that you intend proceeding with destruction of surplus stocks of silver proof coins for recovery of their silver bullion content. We confirm that we will be arranging destruction of stocks of 1983 dated proof sets held by the Royal Mint and that similar action will be arranged in respect of the coins which you will be returning to us. Assuming the quantities of coins mentioned, a bullion account will be opened in the name of the States of Jersey Treasury with an opening balance of 10140 ounces, on which we will draw for any new orders for silver coins.

£2 Royal Wedding Coins

We note that you also have a stock of base metal circulation coins available for destruction. These coins were struck in an alloy of 70% copper, 25% zinc and 5% nickel, which I confirm will be suitable for incorporation in orders for your £1 nickel brass coins.

Assuming that the material be held in stock for use on further orders, we propose an additional charge of £50 for handling and storage. The material will then be allocated to your orders on the basis of 1.05 kilos of material for each 1 kilo finished coin weight. This adjustment covers costs of alloying the material to the correct £1 composition plus metal loss.

We trust that this proposal is acceptable. If you wish to return the coins for disposal, we would be grateful if you could let us have prior notification of despatch and packing details.
