Mr J L Williams of Maida Vale returned to the Royal Mint 65 of the Jersey 20p Piedforts he bought from Jersey complaining they were poor quality and unsaleable. These were sent to Quality Assurance Branch (a report from Martin Hughes dated 21 July 1982 refers) which accepts that there are 28 rejects and 33 marginal rejects (plus 4 acceptable coins). I do not wish this dealer to pass on his complaint to Jersey as it may cause them to examine the remainder of the coins in stock and find a great many more rejects. I, therefore, propose to supply Mr Williams with 65 good quality pieces produced from buffed blanks to minimise the risk of any possibility of him complaining to Jersey and causing us many more problems.

It is understood that most of the Jersey pieces were produced from burnished blanks which, of course, was also the cause of initial problems with the UK 20p Piedfort. Would you, therefore, please arrange for 65 Jersey 20p Piedfort pieces to be manufactured from buffed blanks and supplied to Mr J L Williams as soon as possible.

If there are any problems, please let me know.







Re your letter of 29th March 1982 regarding the issue of a commemorative version of your 20 pence coin struck in sterling silver.

As discussed with Mr. Monins, I have restricted our quotation to a piedforte version of the coin and have pleasure in submitting the following offer for your consideration:-

Prices

In view of the small number involved, the price per piece is considerably higher than that quoted for the silver £1 coin struck late in 1980. The FOB price per piece would be £5.30.

Packing

The price quoted includes packing in a screw capsule and in a pouch.

Bullion

The price excludes the cost of bullion which at present value would be approximately £1.20 per piece. We would charge the actual cost of bullion when we received your confirmation that bullion should be purchased for the coins. We would require that bullion for the quantity of coins being taken for delivery in Jersey be prepaid at the time of purchase of the bullion. The Royal Mint would finance any bullion for coins which it was allowed to market.

Master Tools

The cost of master tools has already been charged against the circulation coins, and there would be no further charge for toolwork.

Marketing

The Royal Mint would be pleased to market some of these coins on your behalf. I am advised by Mr. Monin that the minting limit is 1,500 and that it is possible that you will take delivery of the entire quantity in Jersey. If you wish the Royal Mint to consider marketing some of the coins, then our marketing proposals would be as follows:-

1. The selling price of the coin, exclusive of V.A.T., would be £13.50.
2. We would pay a royalty to the States Treasury of £2.70 for each coin sold by the Royal Mint on your behalf.
3. The Royal Mint would bear the cost of bullion, production and marketing of all coins sold through the Royal Mint.


I enclose photographs of the model for the proposed Jersey 20 pence coin.

The model has been prepared as a result of some further photography supplied by Mr. Monin to our Chief Engraver and it shows the lighthouse in greater detail than on the original sketches. You will note also that the year 1982 is shown in incuse letters on the rock formation. This has been done to ensure that the relief on the coin keeps it within the edge thickness tolerances of the United Kingdom coin.

You will note that our photographer has attempted to show you the approximate shape of the 20 pence, but that the rim used for the model still shows in the photograph. The rim on the coin will not be circular as appears on the model, but will conform to the same style as the existing 50 pence.






Thank you for your letter of 29th March confirming your order for the 20 pence to the original design. I note your requirement for 200,000 of these coins to be ready for delivery by the end of May.

I have booked the metal for the coins and confirm that at current metal prices the price of the coins will be £24.97 per thousand. There will be an additional charge for the preparation of the model for your new reverse design and for the full set of master tools. This additional charge will amount to £2,750.

I note you also require a quantity of silver proof coins and for a proposal from the Royal Mint for further marketing. I have asked our Costing Section to let me have full costs for the production of the proof coin in silver and I will let you have the details as soon as they are available.

As advised on the telephone, it is not possible in the time-scale to produce coins with a design which is suitable for inclusion in the style of rim used for the United Kingdom. Not only would the design you have already chosen have to be re-modelled, but there is an additional tooling requirement which would cause a delay of approximately 6 - 8 weeks. This is because of the nature of the lettering and the internal border which requires some hand-cutting after the major part of the design has been machine cut. We could not produce 20 pence coins for Jersey to the specification of the United Kingdom coin prior to August 1982. As it is your

requirement for coins to be available by the first week in June, we are proceeding on the basis that your coins should be struck with the rim similar to that of the 50 pence coin. I confirm that the edge thickness tolerance will be within the legislation laid down for the United Kingdom coins. We have already ensured that the Guernsey coin is produced to this specification, and it has a similar border to the existing 50 pence. The weight and diameter of your coin will be identical to that of the United Kingdom coin because the same blank will be used, the only difference being in the form of the design which is stamped on the blank.

I will let you have the other costs as soon as they are available.

Thank you for your letter dated 23rd March 1982, and for the enclosure of three versions of the proposed 20 pence coin.

After discussions with the Treasurer of the States I approve the original design. We are aware of the advice given by some members of the Royal Mint Advisory Committee, however this design is one of a series of Jersey landmarks which are to be used on other denominations in the future and as such are required to be identifiable rather than representational.

We shall require a mintage of 200,000 of the 20 pence coins to be ready for delivery by the date of issue of the similar United Kingdom coin. We also require 1,500 silver coins to be available at the same time. Would you please send formal marketing proposals and full costings so that the order may be confirmed.

I should also like your assurance that the Jersey coins when produced will match the United Kingdom 20 pence coin's tolerances as to weight and dimension so that they may be used in coin-machines which have been manufactured to accept the United Kingdom 20 pence coins.

In particular I would like your assurance that the lack of a broad rim on the Jersey coin will not affect weight or dimension comparisons with the United Kingdom 20 pence coin. In view of past difficulties in this respect this is considered a most important aspect.

Ian Monins spoke to me regarding modelling the coin with a broad edge similar to the UK 20p. I have spoken to our Chief Engraver who advises:-

- i) The design is not really suitable for such a broad border.
- ii) The toolwork required to produce that style could not be done in time for a June issue. The work involves special reductions onto brass, followed by hand engraving then recutting into steel. The extra time involved is 6 to 8 weeks so that your coin would not be available until about August.

Grateful for your urgent advice on designs.


We have now had the opportunity of examining the comments from the Royal Mint Advisory Committee on the proposed Jersey 20p design. The feeling seems to be that the lighthouse is too realistic and that a formalised design of a lighthouse would be more suitable. The suggestions are that the horizon and the sea be removed, that the lighthouse itself takes prominence, and that the perspective given by the horizon is removed. It has also been suggested that you may like to consider enlarging the size of the lighthouse so that the top of the lighthouse falls between the words "Bailiwick" and "Of". As you are aware, members of your Committee can disregard these views if they so wish and select the design they favour most.

I would be grateful if you could pass these views to your Committee and let me have their instructions for the preparation of the model as soon as possible. I would suggest in view of the time-scale for the production of the coins that I receive the views of the Committee as soon as possible.


