



To commemorate the thirteenth Commonwealth Games, held in Edinburgh, Scotland in 1986, the Royal Mint has been authorised to strike limited quantities of 2 Pounds silver proof and uncirculated legal tender commemorative Crowns.

The Commonwealth Games were first held in Hamilton, Canada in 1930, when 11 countries and 400 competitors took part. In 1986, 58 countries in the Commonwealth Games Federation are expected to participate. Competitors will take part in 10 sports - Athletics, Badminton, Swimming and Diving, Cycling, Rowing, Boxing, Bowling, Shooting, Weight-Lifting and Wrestling - plus Canoeing and Judo as demonstration sports. The Games are likely to attract over 500 million viewers and listeners.

The obverse design features the Raphael Maklouf effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

The reverse design, the work of Norman Sillman, features a male and female runner above which is the inscription "Bailiwick of Jersey". Below appears the denominational value and the date "1986".

The coin also bears an edge inscription "XIII Commonwealth Games" along with a cross crosslet, the mintmark of the Royal Mint.



Public response to this series has been extremely disappointing. The collection of twelve coins did not generate the interest which had been anticipated, and there is no doubt that interest during the immediate period of the Games was adversely affected by the late decision of several Commonwealth countries not to participate. The coins will remain on sale for a further period, though it is likely that any further sales will be relatively modest.

We are extremely sorry that the coins were not better received. As you will be aware, the Royal Mint self-financed the project, including costs for designs and master tools, and Jersey's liability was limited to coins which you purchased for local sale.

I confirm that we will be paying a royalty of 5% of retail prices to the Commonwealth Games Organising Committee, in addition to the 10% royalty which you are due on sales of these coins.



### COMMONWEALTH GAMES 12 COIN SETS

We have discussed this topic, reference our telephone conversation of 14 March. However, for the record, certain points need to be clarified.

With regard to your criticism of Mr Calford's memo on this subject dated 13 March, I would support his view that delivery of the complete sets of coin will not be completed until mid-April. basis of this assumption is that to date, customer approval has not been received from one customer, namely Jersey. Furthermore, it is apparent that using the normal method of contact with this customer, it is unlikely that this approval will be obtained before the first week in April, hence the delivery date quoted.

Whilst considering this subject, it is worth reminding everyone that there is a standing instruction which implies that no coin should be released from any production department prior to receiving the appropriate customer's approval.

This position raises a pertinent point regarding the content of future mailshots, should they be issued before the appropriate customer approval has been received? With regard to the specific case of Jersey, they may find the position totally unacceptable to them, which allows their coins to be issued and on general sale by the Royal Mint, knowing that they have not approved the design

Finally, with regard to the specific request in your memo dated 13 March, where you indicate the requirement for 500 complete sets before the end of March 1986, this project was costed using economic batch sizes of 5000 and 10,000 pieces. Should production respond to your latest request and produce in batches of 500, the manufacturing costs would significantly escalate, possibly by a factor of up to 5 times the estimated cost. In addition, it would disrupt the production cycle of other work during this very busy period, again attracting further additional costs.

I would add in closing that should the decision be made to change our present policy, both with regard to the issue of non-approved products and reducing the economic batch size, the Production department will co-operate accordingly. However, I must discuss this subject with Mr Gravenor in order to establish the course of action to follow.



Ruth Hill recently sent me a draft of the information leaflet for individual coins, which I approved.

However, I regret that Jersey have now requested an amendment, and they require the second paragraph on page 2/3 to read as follows:

"The Commonwealth Games were first held in Hamilton, Canada in 1930, when eleven countries and four hundred competitors took part. In 1986, fifty eight countries in the Commonwealth Games Federation are expected to participate. Jersey, the largest of the Channel Islands, will be represented by fifteen competitors. They will take part in five sports – athletics, bowling, cycling, shooting and swimming and diving. The Games are likely to attract over five hundred million viewers and listeners."

I am sorry for this late amendment, and would be grateful to have your confirmation that it will be incorporated in the information leaflets for the Jersey coin.

The obverse design features the Raphael Maklouf effigy of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II.

The coin also bears an edge inscription "XIII Commonwealth Games" along with a cross crosslet, the mintmark of the Royal Mint.

I am pleased to provide details of the coins in the 1986 Commonwealth Games collection. The Games will be held in Edinburgh between 24 July and 2 August and it is expected that teams from 58 countries will participate. Of these countries 12 have authorised the issue of coins to form the Collection.

The United Kingdom £2 coin will be issued for the first time in a metal other than gold. It is also a new departure for a UK Coin to commemorate a sporting event. As with the other eleven countries the coin will be issued in two versions, a proof in 925 silver and an uncirculated in 500 silver. The weight (15.98g) and diameter (28.40mm) are the same for both coins which has the effect of increasing the gauge for the uncirculated coin to 2.85mm whereas the gauge for the proof coin is 2.67mm. Both coins carry the edge inscription "XIII Commonwealth Games Scotland 1986". The Llantrisant Mint Mark also appears on the edge as a separation device. Minting of these coins will be limited to 75000 pieces proof and 125000 pieces uncirculated.

Prices for these collections, exclusive of VAT, are £286.96 for the proof and £151.30 for the uncirculated. These prices include the supply of 12 coin collection cases; a de-luxe crushed velvet case for the proof coins and a framed display stand for uncirculated coins.

Collections may be ordered in two ways:-

- a) Order of the complete collection for immediate delivery. With such orders a UK 1986 proof set will be supplied free with each collection (a de-luxe set with the proof collection and a set in blue leatherette cover with the uncirculated collection).

I anticipate that the UK Coin will be issued as the fifth in the series.

## THE XIII COMMONWEALTH GAMES E2 COMMEMORATIVE COIN

The 1986 XIII Commonwealth Games £2 coin is the first commemorative coin ever to be issued by the United Kingdom to mark a sporting event.

It will also be the first time that a £2 coin, other than in gold, has been issued in the United Kingdom.

Designed by sculptor Norman Sillman, the reverse features a thistle encircled by a laurel wreath, superimposed on St Andrew's Cross. The obverse features the new Raphael Maklouf portrait of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II. The edge bears the inscription "XIII COMMONWEALTH GAMES SCOTLAND 1986", together with the cross crosslet mintmark of the Royal Mint. The coin forms part of a special collection of 12 Commonwealth Games commemorative coins being produced by the Royal Mint on behalf of participating countries.

Several versions of the £2 coin are being minted:-

The Standard Coin; which will be available nearer the time of the Games.

The Brilliant Uncirculated Coin; which will be available from the Royal Mint on its own in a special Commonwealth Games pack, and is currently available as part of the 1986 Brilliant Uncirculated Coin Collection (rétail prices, £3.95 and £7.95 respectively).

The Proof Coin; which is now available from the Royal Mint in the limited edition 1986 Proof Coin Set (retail price, £21.25).

These three coins are all manufactured from nickel-brass, measure 28.40 millimetres in diameter and weigh 15.98 grammes.

Two silver versions will also be produced in limited editions: The <u>Silver Uncirculated</u> (fineness 0.500) and the <u>Sterling Silver Proof</u> (retail prices, £12.95 and £21.95 respectively).

A Gold Proof 22 carat £2 coin is also being produced (retail price to be announced).

The coins are intended as commemorative pieces, but are all legal tender, at the face value of £2. There is no intention to introduce a £2 coin for general circulation.

The Royal Mint will contribute an agreed percentage from the sales of collectors' coins to the Commonwealth Games. It is estimated that this will generate in excess of £250,000 for the Commonwealth Games.

The Games bring together sportsmen and women from all parts of the Commonwealth, in what has become known as the 'friendly games'. 

#### Bullion

The price for bullion is indicative only and is based on £4.30 per ounce. Our engravers have noted that the lettering is rather weak in parts, and this defect will be put right during the tooling operation.

The comment was made that the coin will have the date 1986 on both sides. There are precedents for having the date on both sides of the coin, and in fact your Liberation coin included the date "1985" on both sides. If you felt that one of the dates was superfluous, the one on the reverse could be deleted without spoiling the balance of the design.

### COMMONWEALTH GAMES COMMEMORATIVE COIN PROGRAMME

I am writing in confirmation of our telephone discussion about adaptation of one of the designs which you submitted for the United Kingdom Commonwealth Games  $\pounds 2$ .

A total of 12 countries, including the United Kingdom, will be issuing coins commemorating the 1986 Commonwealth Games. One of these is Jersey, and they have expressed interest in your design of two runners (photocopy attached for reference). The design will require some modification, partly as Jersey wishes to see the runners in modern kit, and partly as the thistle and St Andrews Cross would be inappropriate.

The design will need to include the name of the country (Bailiwick of Jersey), the inscription "XIII Commonwealth Games 1986" and the denomination which will be £2. Possibly the inscription "XIII Commonwealth Games 1986" could be left to an incuse lettered edge inscription, if you consider the required wording to be an insurmountable barrier. Preferably we would like to have two designs, one with the total inscription on the design and one with the shorter version.

#### Fee

We have been set a tight budget for the manufacture and sale of the overseas coins in this series, which necessitates the fee we are able to offer you being limited to £400 for initial sketches and a plaster model. In the event that, for any reason, your design cannot be progressed to a plaster model, a separate fee for sketches will be negotiated with you.



# REPORT OF A MEETING WITH THE STATES TREASURY, JERSEY ON TUESDAY, 3 SEPTEMBER 1985

Present:

Mr Leslie May, Treasurer Mr F H Le Marquand, Chief Cashier Mr Ian Monins, Numismatic Adviser

The following is a brief summary of the items discussed :-

#### 1. Commonwealth Games Issue

There has been some criticism by members of the States Treasury at the agreement to participate in this coin scheme and the Treasurer was under pressure to reduce the minting limits. I said this was unacceptable and he wanted an assurance that there was reasonable expectation of selling up to or close to the minting limit. I explained that the scheme incorporated the UK coin which was a catalyst and it was intended to entice collectors to subscribe to the coin programme by promising subscribers that they would be guaranteed I said that the Jersey coin the UK coin which will have low minting limits. was planned to be issued before the UK coin in the series and, therefore, it I also said that there was a had a good chance of being successful. possibility that we would be able to persuade a major credit card company to offer the series to their customers but obviously if this were not to happen sales would be lower. I also said I believed there was a reasonable expectation of selling about 5,000 of the coins, including those sold in Mr May wanted an assurance that in the event Jersey, under normal conditions. of the series not being as successful as anticipated that no announcement would be made about the numbers of coins sold. I said it was entirely up to Jersey to authorise the release of statistics about the number of their coins minted and sold and that their permission would be sought before we released informa-Given these assurances Mr May seemed happy to proceed. concern was expressed about the design submitted and it was agreed to send alternative sketches (this has been done).

#### 2. Complaints

The Treasurer complained about staining of silver coins minted in 1983 and in particular drew attention to the fact that most of the remaining stock of 7-coin sets and some of the individual £1 silver pieces minted in the same year were affected. However, the incidence of staining was far greater on sets than on individual pieces. I was shown the stocks and I can verify that I could not find a single set which did not contain at least one discoloured coin, whereas the vast majority of individual silver £1 coins were in good condition and in a random inspection I could not find any individual tarnished pieces. The Treasury view is that there was something wrong with the collars

which were a different colour in the sets to individual pieces. I brought back two sets which were typical of the staining problem, and also two individual £1 coins but these had been selected from the total issues submitted and had been put to one side with about 30/40 other pieces. (Mr Green to obtain a report and in particular, if possible, an explanation as to why the sets are badly discoloured whereas the individual pieces minted at the same time show far less incidence of staining). The Treasury also want to know if coins can be cleaned either by us or by them. They do not feel they can sell the stained coins whether or not it is reasonable to say silver coins minted 2/3 years ago will inevitably show signs of aging.

## $3. \quad \frac{1}{2}p$

I raised the question of mixed bags of  $\frac{1}{2}p$  in store in Jersey which the UK Banks had mentioned several times at various meetings. The Jersey Treasury were unwilling to agree to the same arrangements that applied to pre-decimal coins whereby bags of mixed coin were sent to the Royal Mint for us to take samples to determine the proportion of UK, Jersey or Guernsey coins and paid for at either full face value (for UK coin) and at scrap value for others. (At the meeting held at Grosvenor Gardens on 5 September 1985 I informed Mr McClinton and Mr Coventry that the Jersey Treasury wanted a representative of the Banks to discuss with Mr May the problem as he was not willing to conduct negotiations via the Royal Mint).

#### 4. Circulation Coinage

There was no likelihood of any further orders for circulation coin although Mr Le Marquand told me there was some shortage of certain denominations at present, but he expected that at the end of the tourist season in a few weeks time large quantities of coin would flow back to the Banks. In Jersey the peak issue period is during the tourist season rather than at Christmas.

I confirm the following points mentioned during our discussion relating to the Commonwealth Games issue:-

- (a) I have sent you by post today alternative sketches which it may be possible to modify for the reverse design of the Jersey coin.
- (b) The Commonwealth Games coin scheme consists of twelve countries' coins, the issue will be on the basis of one coin per month starting in January 1986 and we have reserved a slot for the Jersey This will be issued before the UK commemorative coin for May 1986. silver crown; the UK coin will probably be issued in June 1986.
- (c) The minting limits for each of the overseas issues will be 20,000 Sterling Silver Proofs and 50,000 500 standard Silver Uncs. Whilst these limits may seem high, we cannot be sure at this juncture whether we will be able to persuade organisations such as AMEX, Diners Club, etc, to promote the series and if they do so sales will be much higher than if the organisations are not prepared to offer the series.
- (d) Our forecast of minimum sales is 5,000 Silver Proofs and 5,000 Silver Uncs with a most likely figure of 10,000 for each type. These figures make provision for local sales in Jersey.
- (e) Under no circumstances will the Royal Mint announce the number of coins sold for this issue, or any other, without the authority of the Jersey Treasury. If, however, the issue is a complete sellout, then it is assumed that Jersey will have no objection to our publicising the fact but it is understood you will not wish the numbers to be disclosed otherwise.

#### Reverse

I am enclosing photographs of a sketch which our artist has prepared for your consideration. He was told that you intend participating in events for athletics, cycling, shooting, swimming and lawn bowls, and he considered that these would best be illustrated in symbolic form. He therefore proposes symbols for each event, with a mass of water symbolising swimming as well as the sea surrounding Jersey. The design also features your crest, which has been taken from your letterhead, together with the symbol of the XIII Commonwealth Games.

We trust that these proposals receive your favourable consideration and we look forward to receiving your further instructions. If you are not content with the proposed treatment, we will naturally prepare further designs for your consideration, if you could kindly suggest suitable reference material.

As promised, here is an idea for the Jersey coin. Before you throw it aside, may I make the following remarks.


- D I greatly admine the 20p. coin with the income lettering. Could the Justy coin be treated in the same way?

If the design is rejected, then I am quite happy if you wish be call in another designer.




