# HEBE 1861



The final coin - One Pound - features a brig, built in Jersey in 1861. This is one of a Seven Coin Series of ships built in the 19th century when shipbuilding was a major industry and before sail gave way to steam power and the replacement of wooden hulls by iron.

The States of Jersey first introduced its own coinage in 1813 when "Three shilling and Eighteen pence" tokens were minted at the Royal Mint. It was in 1841 in the Reign of Queen Victoria that the denominations of one thirteenth, one twenty-sixth and one fifty-second of a shilling were issued.

Those denominations gave way to the traditional penny, half penny and farthing in 1877.

The States Treasury continued with its own lower denomination coins, including the three penny piece, until 1968 when cupro-nickel coins valued at ten pence and five pence were introduced. These were followed later by other denominations and today there are seven standard circulation coins.

**Brilliant Uncirculated Coin Set**

I have given further consideration to the production of a BU coin set and as a result I would like you to consider the draft enclosed.

It is intended to make the set available not later than the end of March 1992 and it is to include the new dimension 10 pence coin and the £1 coin featuring the HEBE. I see no objection to these being included at this stage even though they will precede the standard circulations coins by two or three months. The only slight doubt I have concerns the 50 pence coin. Are plans afoot to reduce the dimensions of this coin?

Could I ask you to talk with your contacts at Zenith Printers and allow them to use their design and colour expertise to produce a "mock" presentation.

It would also be beneficial to have an indication of the cost of the finished article inclusive of the coins. All the coins should be dated 1992, but any redating charges should be excluded as these will be met with the orders for standard circulation coins in that year. The quantity required for local distribution is likely to be 3,000. As with the 1987 set I would welcome the Mint's involvement in the marketing of these presentations and agreement on a royalty per set can be reached in due course.

Could I just mention that the slide and negative are the property of the Tourism Department and I have to return them within two months of today's date. Will you kindly ensure that I am able to meet this deadline.
