EL ALAMEIN COMMEMORATIVE ISSUE

In view of the good success achieved with the Jersey Battle of Britain issue I would like you to approach Jersey to persuade them to authorise an issue commemorating the 50th Anniversary of the Battle of El Alamein.

This was a significant turning point of World War II (Churchill said 'This may not be the beginning of the end, but it is certainly the end of the beginning') and involved two famous generals - Montgomery and Rommel.

I would recommend to Jersey a 4-coin gold set - 500 issue limit, a 65mm £5 silver proof - 5,000 issue limit, and a crown-size £2 silver proof - 10,000 issue limit. Royalties of £90 per gold set and £9.00 and £4.00 for the 65mm and crown-size silver proofs respectively would also be recommended.

Provisional forecast sales would be :

Issue Limit	500 gold sets	- Royalty £45,000
500	1500 65mm silver	- Royalty £13,500
5,000	2500 crowns, silver	- Royalty £10,000
10,000		

Provisional forecast Royalty : £68,500

There are opportunities for promotion of WWII products between now and 1995 which could significantly increase sales of the silver products, hence the need for the issue limits to be higher than our initial provisional estimates of sale. In view of the good success achieved with the Jersey Battle of Britain issue I would like you to approach Jersey to persuade them to authorise an issue commemorating the 50th Anniversary of the Battle of El Alamein.

This was a significant turning point of World War II (Churchill said 'This may not be the beginning of the end, but it is certainly the end of the beginning') and involved two famous generals - Montgomery and Rommel.

I would recommend to Jersey a 4-coin gold set - 500 issue limit, a 65mm £5 silver proof - 5,000 issue limit, and a crown-size £2 silver proof - 10,000 issue limit. Royalties of £90 per gold set and £9.00 and £4.00 for the 65mm and crown-size silver proofs respectively would also be recommended.

Provisional forecast sales would be :

500 gold sets	- Royalty £45,000
1500 65mm silver	- Royalty £13,500
2500 crowns, silver	- Royalty £10,000

Provisional forecast Royalty : £68,500

There are opportunities for promotion of WWII products between now and 1995 which could significantly increase sales of the silver products, hence the need for the issue limits to be higher than our initial provisional estimates of sale. On no account, however, must the 4-coin gold set issue limit be raised above 500 sets!

ARTICLE 2.

THE NEW DECIMAL CURRENCY.

On and after the appointed day the denominations of money in the currency of the Island shall be the pound sterling and the new penny, the new penny being one-hundredth part of a pound sterling.

ARTICLE 3.

COINAGE OF THE NEW CURRENCY.

(1) The Committee is hereby authorized to issue coinage of the new currency of a denominational value not exceeding in any one year such sum as the Committee may determine.

(2) Coins issued in pursuance of this Article shall be of such denomination or denominations as the Committee shall determine.

(3) Coins issued in pursuance of this Article shall be issued under the direction of the Committee which shall determine the design, weight and composition thereof.

ARTICLE 4.

LEGAL TENDER.

(1) Coins issued by the Mint in accordance with the provisions of section two of the Decimal Currency Act, 1967 or in accordance with the provisions of the Coinage Acts, 1870 to 1946, and not called in by proclamation under paragraph (5) of section eleven of the Coinage Act, 1870, or coins issued by the Committee shall be legal tender as follows, that is to say—

(a) coins of cupro-nickel or silver of denominations of more than ten new pence or two shillings, for payment of any amount not exceeding ten pounds ;

(b) coins of cupro-nickel or silver of denominations of not more than ten new pence or two shillings, for payment of any amount not exceeding five pounds ;

(c) coins of bronze, for payment of any amount not exceeding twenty new pence or four shillings.

(2) In this Article " coins of bronze " includes threepences of mixed metal.

(3) Coins of the old currency other than gold coins and coins in respect of which proclamation is made in the United Kingdom under paragraph (5) of section fifteen of the Decimal Currency Act, 1969, shall not be legal tender after the end of the transitional period.

(4) For the purposes of being used for any payment in accordance with the foregoing provisions of this Article a coin of either the old or the new currency may be treated as being a current

"ARTICLE 4**Legal tender**

We have the honour to refer to an Act passed by the States of Jersey on 29th May, 1990 entitled "Decimal Currency (Amendment No. 5) (Jersey) Law, 1990" and, in accordance with custom, to furnish our report on the Act.

The Finance and Economics Committee is presently empowered under Article 3(5) of the Decimal Currency (Jersey) Law, 1971 (Recueil des Lois, Tome 1970-72 page 183, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Law") to make orders calling in coins issued in pursuance of that Article. The Committee wishes to make an order calling in five pence coins issued not only in pursuance of the principal Law, but also in pursuance of the Decimal Currency (Jersey) Law, 1969 (Recueil des Lois, Tome 1968-69, page 197, hereinafter referred to as "the 1969 Law") which was repealed by

the principal Law. The Committee has been advised that its power to call in coins is limited to coins issued in pursuance of the principal Law and does not extend to coins issued in pursuance of the 1969 Law. In order to remedy this hiatus, the Act under review would extend the power of the Committee so as to include a power to call in coins issued in pursuance of the 1969 Law.

To that end, Article 1 of the Act under review would repeal Article 3(5) of the principal Law, whilst Article 2 of the Act under review would substitute Article 4 of the principal Law and insert an additional Article 4A which would provide the Finance and Economics Committee with the necessary enabling powers.

The opportunity has been taken, without making any substantive amendment to Article 4 of the principal Law, to consolidate the several amendments to that Article which have been effected since its enactment in 1971, and also to delete the existing references in that Article to the Coinage Acts 1870 to 1946 and to replace them with references to the Coinage Act 1971 which repealed those Acts.

Article 3 of the Act under review would contain the usual Article of citation.

Thank you for your letter of 5 February.

So far as the vending machine industry is concerned, the Royal Mint is consulting those companies involved and no doubt these will be the same people who provide vending machines in Jersey. The general view is that the increased thickness of the 1p and 2p coins can easily be overcome by the vending machine industry providing they have adequate notice. Incidentally we have already told the vending industry that the United Kingdom Government will not pay compensation. I will keep you informed of further developments.

So far as the introduction of the coins is concerned, although no announcement is being made yet, it is forecast that the new copper plated steel 1p will be introduced in the United Kingdom in January 1991 and the 2p copper plated steel coin a year later.

I will write again when we have further information on this subject.

All specifications of the new United Kingdom 5 pence and 10 pence coins have now been published, and I thought that you might be interested to see the enclosed leaflet, which summarises these details together with the issue dates and change over arrangements. ~~Two~~ ^{Two} sets of the new coins are also enclosed for internal use. As you will appreciate, these coins are not yet generally available, and you are asked to ensure that they remain in your safe custody.

We are now well into bulk production of the smaller 5 pence coins, in order to ensure that adequate supplies are available for issue to banks well before the June 1990 change over date. So far as Jersey coins are concerned, we should suggest that your order be confirmed not later than January 1990, on the assumption that your change over will follow the same timetable. As you are already aware, the United Kingdom is retaining the same reverse designs, as an aid to ready identification of the smaller coins. It is of course up to you to decide whether to retain your existing reverses or to adopt new designs. If the latter course of action is preferred, we would suggest that the matter receives consideration later this year, with the target of arriving at an agreed design by January 1990.

We consider shipbuilding to be a most suitable subject for a coin series and worthy of submission to your committee. It is technically feasible to reduce the designs to the size of a £1 coin. However the comment is that they appear so promising, that they are worthy of reproduction at a larger size, which would display them to better advantage. If it would be at all helpful, we would be happy to prepare a sketch of one of the designs and have it photographed down to actual size, to give you a better idea of the general effect.

I am giving some thought to the implications of the reduction in size of the 5 pence coin in June 1990 and the 10 pence coin some two years later and would be pleased if you would provide me with an approximate cost of the work involved so I may assess the situation prior to discussing the matter with the Finance and Economics Committee.

I am considering the alternative of producing a new set of circulation coins in 1990 rather than reduce the existing design of the 5 pence and 10 pence coins so it would be helpful to have an indication of the design and tooling costs and timetable of :-

- (a) existing design at reduced dimension - 5 pence and 10 pence coin.
- (b) new design on all seven circulation coins

The obverse design would remain as at present, except for re-dating.

With the Parish £1 series ending in June 1989 it will be necessary to produce a new design for the £1 coin in 1990 so it may be advantageous to have a total replacement of the existing designs.

Any views or advice you may have will be welcomed.

And Whereas by Our Proclamation made on the twenty-eighth day of July One thousand nine hundred and seventy-one We proclaimed, directed and ordained that certain coins of the old currency issued by Our Mint before the fifteenth day of February One thousand nine hundred and seventy-one including coins of the denomination of one shilling should after the coming into force of that Proclamation be treated as coins of the new currency made by Our Mint in accordance with section 2 of the Decimal Currency Act 1967 and in the case of the coins of the denomination of one shilling as being of the denomination of five pence:

And Whereas it now appears to Us desirable to call in certain coins of the denomination of five pence:

2. - (b) a variation from the said diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
- (c) a variation from the said standard fineness of five per mille.
3. (1) A new coin of silver of the denomination of five pence shall be made, being a coin of a standard weight of 5.65518 grammes, a standard diameter of 23.595 millimetres, and a standard composition of thirty-seven fortieths fine silver and three-fortieths alloy, or millesimal fineness 925, and being circular in shape.
- (2) In the making of the said silver coin a remedy (that is, a variation from the standard weight, diameter or composition or fineness specified above) shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding the following, that is to say:
- (a) a variation from the said standard weight of an amount per coin (measured as the average of a sample of not more than one kilogramme of the coin) of 0.045 grammes; and
 - (b) a variation from the said diameter of 0.125 millimetres per coin; and
 - (c) a variation from the said standard fineness of five per mille.

6. The design of the said new coin shall be as follows:

For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH II D.G.REG.F.D." and the date of the year, and for the reverse a thistle royally crowned, being the badge of Scotland, the figure "5" and the words "FIVE PENCE". The coin shall have a graining upon the edge.

7. This Proclamation shall come into force on the first day of January One thousand nine hundred and ninety.
