To honour the Royal Visit of Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and His Royal Highness The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh to the Channel Islands, the Royal Mint is issuing a limited number of silver Proof £2 commemorative crowns for Guernsey, Jersey and Alderney.

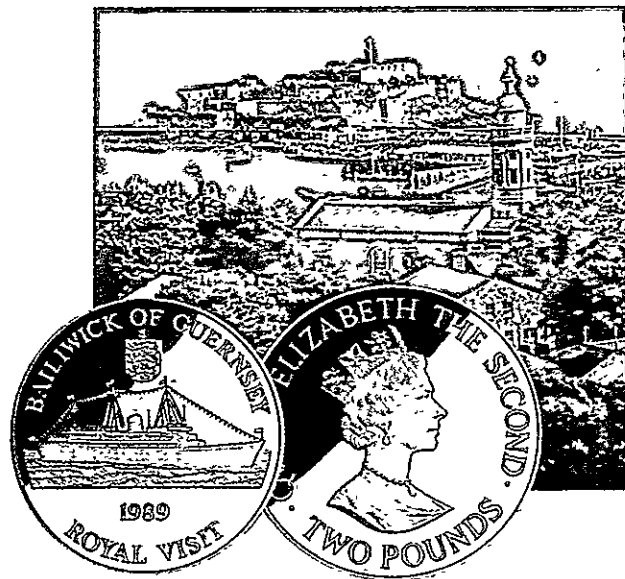
The Channel Islands are set in the Gulf of St. Malo, off the north-west coast of France. The combined land area of the islands is 75

square miles (194 sq km), with a total population of approximately 144,500. Since the Norman Conquest in 1066, the inhabitants of the Channel Islands have been closely linked with Britain. Indeed, through the centuries British Monarchs have been united in their desire to visit the islands and appreciate their charm and magnificent natural beauty.

This is only the second visit by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II to the Islands, her first was in 1978 shortly after the Silver Jubilee. Therefore this long awaited visit has great significance and is fittingly commemorated with the issue of these superb silver Proof crowns.

Bailiwick of Guernsey

The most westerly of the Channel Islands is the island of Guernsey. Its capital St. Peter Port is a most attractive town, set upon a hillside overlooking its busy harbour. The harbour provides ideal facilities for the influx of holidaymakers that arrive by sea, and also for the export of fresh produce for the French and British markets.



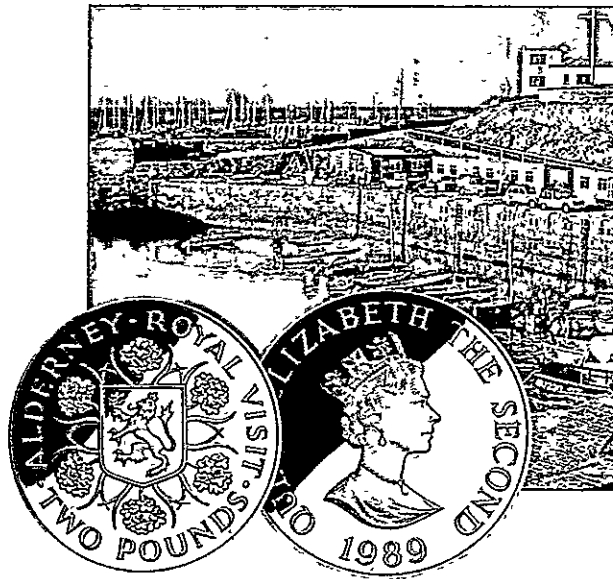
The obverse of the Guernsey Royal Visit commemorative crown bears Raphael Maklouf's portrait of Her Majesty The Queen, with the inscription, QUEEN ELIZABETH THE SECOND - TWO POUNDS.

The reverse of the coin was designed by Royal Mint engraver Robert Elderton, and features a splendid representation of Her Majesty's Yacht Britannia. Above this appears the Guernsey Crest and the commemorative inscription BAILIWICK OF GUERNSEY - 1989 ROYAL VISIT.

23 MAY 1989

Island of Alderney

Twenty-one miles north-east of Guernsey is the picturesque isle of Alderney. Its capital St. Anne, is situated in the centre of the small island providing the site for the island's only airport. Despite recent developments Alderney still retains all its old charm and fascinating atmosphere.



This silver Proof commemorative crown, the first coin ever issued for Alderney, features on its obverse an elegant portrait of Her Majesty The Queen, by the sculptor Raphael Maklouf. The surrounding inscription reads QUEEN ELIZABETH THE SECOND - 1989.

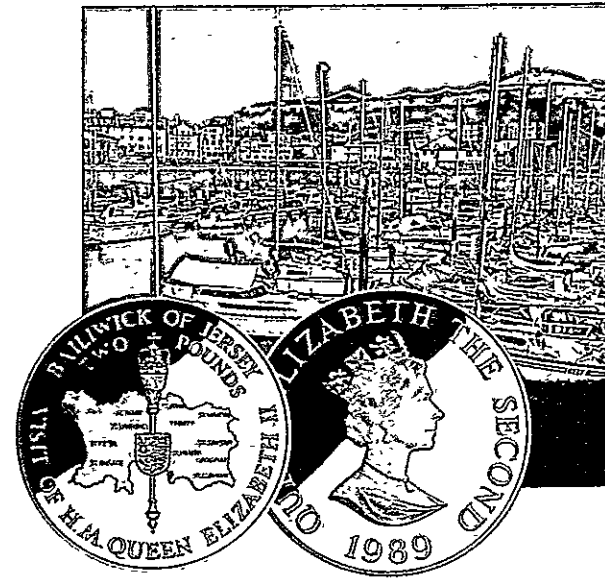
Designed by Michael Rizzello OBE, the reverse design features the Arms of Alderney surrounded by thistle flowers, with the inscription ALDERNEY - ROYAL VISIT - TWO POUNDS.

Bailiwick of Jersey

Jersey is the largest of the Channel Islands with an area of forty-five square miles. Visitors to the island will find that Jersey still retains a French flavour, possibly because of its close proximity to the French coast.

St. Helier is the island's capital and also its main port. It is here that approximately two thirds of Jersey's population reside.



The obverse design of the Jersey Royal Visit commemorative crown bears an effigy of Her Majesty The Queen, by Raphael Maklouf, with the inscription QUEEN ELIZABETH THE SECOND - 1989.

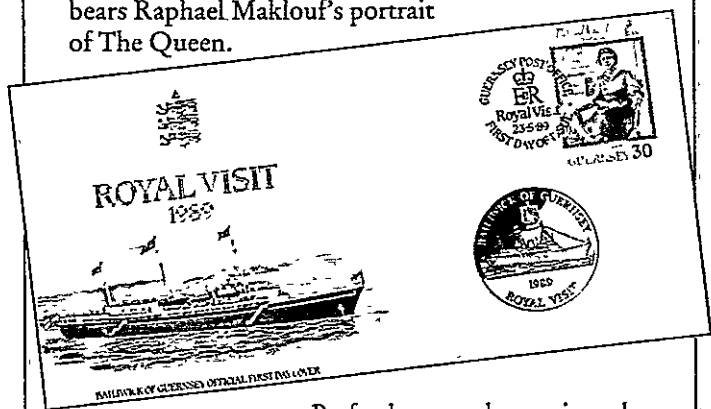
Designed by Robert Elderton, the reverse of the coin features the Royal Coat of Arms of the Bailiwick of Jersey with the Jersey Crest superimposed upon the island's coastline.

The edge of the coin bears an incuse inscription which reads '25 MAY 1989'.

Guernsey Royal Visit Commemorative £2 First Day Covers

Dear Coin Club Member

As you are a collector of silver Proof coins, I know you will be extremely pleased to receive advance information about three superb new commemorative silver crowns. Each of the coins has been struck to honour the visit to the Channel Islands by Her Majesty Queen Elizabeth II and His Royal Highness, The Prince Philip, Duke of Edinburgh.

Islands of Romance and Beauty

The inherent natural beauty and diversity of the Channel Islands has inspired artists, writers and famous historical figures to extol the virtues of the islands for centuries. Indeed, Queen Victoria, upon her visit to Jersey in 1846 commented 'what a pretty rich country this is'. And Victor Hugo in his celebrated romance 'Toilers of the Sea', described the Channel Islands as 'portions of France which have fallen into the sea, and have been picked up by England'. This may be loose geology and though not 'picked up', the islands have been intimately linked with the Crown of England for over 900 years.

Forming part of the Duchy of Normandy at the time of the Conquest in 1066, the Islands' association with the British Monarchy has persisted despite the subsequent loss of Normandy by King John.

The inhabitants of Britain's southernmost islands have continued to remain loyal to the Throne of England. And the enthusiastic response of the Channel Islanders to this historic Royal Visit by Her Majesty The Queen, emphasises the importance of the monarchy to the Channel Islands.

Three Day Royal Tour

On 23 May 1989 Her Majesty The Queen and His Royal Highness, The Prince Philip arrive in Guernsey aboard Her Majesty's Yacht, Britannia, for the start of their three day tour. Over the next two days it is intended that the Royal Party visit the islands of Alderney, Sark and finally Jersey where Her Majesty is to open the resplendent Queen Elizabeth Harbour.

A Royal Tribute

As a fitting tribute to this historic Royal Visit to the Channel Islands, the Royal Mint is to issue a limited number of commemorative silver Proof crowns

for Jersey, Guernsey and Alderney. The coins have been commissioned by the Monetary Authorities of the Bailiwicks of Jersey and Guernsey. Alderney, of course, forms part of the Bailiwick of Guernsey, and this is the first coin bearing the name of the island ever to be issued.

Each crown is exquisitely struck in sterling (.925) silver, and has a denomination of two pounds. The superb designs of these Royal Visit crowns perfectly capture the charm and beauty which is characteristic of the Channel Islands.

A Very Popular Issue



JERSEY - ORDER 980

A complication has arisen about the pricing of trade orders, resulting from inconsistencies between pricing arrangements published by the States Treasury and ourselves. Whereas the Royal Mint has applied its standard trade discounts, the Jersey Treasury has announced a fixed trade price of £20.75. As a result, the Jersey dealer, Ian Molins, can apparently obtain supplies of silver proofs cheaper from a UK dealer than from the States Treasury, who would be his normal source of supply.

The States Treasury accept part of the blame for this problem, in so far as they did not agree trade prices before they were published. We nevertheless are also at fault, in so far as we did not raise the matter before proceeding, as is the normal case with other marketing issues such as the Parish series.

In discussion with the customer, we have stressed that the Royal Mint will not knowingly accept orders for silver proofs for delivery to Jersey. We have also said that we will ask our dealers to respect this restriction, although it is realised that it would be difficult in practice to enforce. It has been agreed that in the event that trade sales exceed 500, which might indicate that supplies were being diverted to Jersey, that the standard royalty on Royal Mint sales be increased by 50 pence from £4 to £4.50 per coin.

JERSEY ROYAL VISIT £2 SILVER PROOFS

Mr Le Marquand has raised the problem of conflicting trade discounts for this issue. He is offering a fixed trade discount whereby dealers obtain coins at £20.75 each, whereas the Royal Mint has announced its normal scale which is as follows:

5 - 19 coins	- 15%
20 - 49 coins	- 20%
50 coins and over	- 25%

Mr Le Marquand is concerned that his main dealer (Ian Molins) can obtain coins more cheaply from a UK dealer such as Spink, than he could directly from the States Treasury, which would be contrary to the spirit of the marketing arrangements, whereby Jersey have sole marketing rights within the Island. Jersey has already published its trade list and is not inclined to vary them to the extent that the trade discount is greater than its own potential profit per coin sold. In recognition of the Royal Mint's part in not consulting about the level of trade discounts, we have offered the reduction in price of 25 pence per silver proof for all coins ordered by Jersey, to facilitate some special arrangement to Ian Molins. Alternatively, it has been suggested that royalties for coins sold by the Royal Mint be increased by 50 pence, in the event that trade sales exceed 500 coins.





THE ROYAL MACE OF THE BAILIFF OF JERSEY

The Royal Mace of the Bailiff of Jersey, borne before the Bailiff at the sittings of the Royal Court and of the Assembly of the States of Jersey, was presented by King Charles II to Jersey on the 28th November 1663 in gratitude for the hospitality which he received from the Island on two occasions during his years of exile.

The Jersey Mace is one of the great maces of the seventeenth century, and consists of eleven separate pieces. It is of silver gilt, 4ft. 8 1/2 ins. long, actually weighs 237 ounces, and has no hall marks, only 23750 marked on the pendant. It was ordered, as appears in "The Book of Warrants of the Lord Chamberlain, Edward, Earl of Manchester, of His Majesty's Household, entered under date 31st July, 1663" by a Warrant to prepare and deliver to "The Bailiff of Jersey a silver mace gilt of 200 ounces". (L.C.5 (107) f. 100 Public Record Office).

On the foot knob of the Mace an inscription in Latin is engraved, of which the following is a translation:—

"Not all doth he deem worthy of such a reward Charles II, King of Great Britain, France and Ireland, as a proof of his royal affection towards the Isle of Jersey (in which he has been twice received in safety when he was excluded from the remainder of his dominions) has willed that this Royal Mace should be consecrated to posterity and has ordered that hereafter it shall be carried before the Bailiffs, in perpetual remembrance of their fidelity not only to his August father Charles I but to His Majesty during the fury of the Civil Wars, when the Island was maintained by the illustrious Philip and George de Carteret, Knights, Bailiffs and Governors of the said Island".

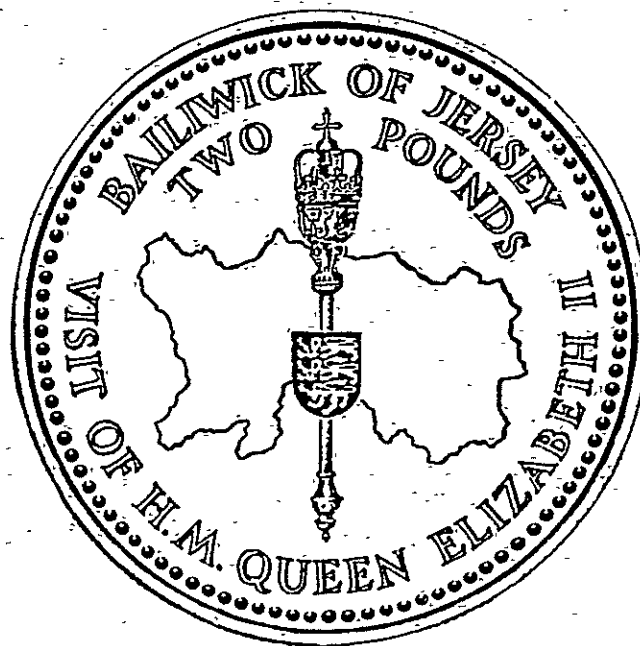

A warning to all

TO MEN and women everywhere, the mere mention of child abuse is as abhorrent as it is emotive, as the events in Cleveland have illustrated all too vividly.

An indication of how seriously society in general views the subject can be gleaned from the knowledge that those who commit one of the grossest abuses of trust known to man face a particularly trying time when in prison, for even among those who have erred in other ways they are vilified.

For this reason, and the fact that society has become more liberal, in that we no longer hang people for stealing a shilling, it has become the practice to cite prison hardship and harassment, and the very real threat of violence, as mitigation against a custodial sentence.

Such mitigation was offered, quite properly, on behalf of a man who appeared at the Royal Court last week for sentencing on charges of gross indecency and indecent assault on a young girl.

Equally properly, the Royal Court took an unusually different view, and instead increased the sanction being asked for by the prosecution by six months.

In giving the Court's decision the Deputy Bailiff, Mr Vernon Tones, said that it was doing so as 'a mark of the Court's revulsion at the nature of the offences'.

Two years in prison, we believe, is an accurate reflection of public abhorrence and concern, and an appropriate warning to others of similar mentality who may be tempted into such abuses of trust.

QUEEN TO OPEN NEW LIBRARY AND HARBOUR

JERSEY'S new harbour development will be named the Elizabeth Harbour and will be officially opened by the Queen when she visits the Island in May.

The final itinerary of the Royal Visit has now been released — and one noticeable omission is the planned presentation by the Education Department to Her Majesty, which was due to take place on College Field during the afternoon.

However, the reluctance of many teachers to staff the gathering has meant that the planned presentation has had to be cancelled.

The Royal Visit will begin on the evening of 24 May, when the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh will host a dinner and reception on board the Royal Yacht *Britannia*.

It is hoped that she will be docked alongside the western arm of the new harbour.

On the morning of 25 May the Queen and the Duke of Edinburgh will be received ashore by the Lieut-Governor, Admiral Sir William Pillar, and the Bailiff, Sir Peter Crill.

Her Majesty will then be invited to open the new harbour, which she will name Elizabeth Harbour. The Harbourmaster, Capt Roy Bullen, said this morning that he was "absolutely delighted" that Her Majesty would perform the opening ceremony.

Following the harbour opening, the Queen and Duke will visit the Town Church before receiving a loyal address from the Bailiff in the States.

Her Majesty will then be driven by open carriage from the Royal Square down Halkett Place to open the new States Library.

After this, the Queen and Prince Philip will attend a sitting of the Royal Court at Mont Orgueil, where she will receive the Homage of the Seigneurs. The public will be able to witness the members of the Royal Court, dressed in full robes, escorting the Royal couple across Castle Green after the Court has risen.

Lunch will be taken at the Jersey Pottery in Gorey Village, which will be given by the States in honour of the visitors, and the Queen will be presented with a silver replica of the Royal Mace by the Bailiff at the lunch.

The replica is being made locally by Mr Richard Blampied and his staff at their Charing Cross workshop.

Children

After lunch, the Queen and the Duke will visit Howard Davis Farm to see a show put on by the three biggest sectors of the economy — finance, agriculture and tourism.

There will also be a show by young people and a display mounted by the Eric Young Orchid Foundation. A large number of the Island's primary schoolchildren will be in attendance there.

After a short visit to Victoria College to allow Her Majesty to present the Queen's Awards and receive a loyal address, the Royal couple will depart for the UK by air.

Hunger strike mother evicted from Heathrow

HUNGER striker Mrs Margaret Ward was evicted from Heathrow yesterday.

But today Mrs Ward, who is fighting for proper access to her two daughters, was due to see the Parliamentary Under-Secretary at the Foreign Office, Mr Timothy Eggar.

Labour MP Clare Short, who has taken up Mrs Ward's case, and the Conservative MP Sir George Young, who has been pushing to try to change the law regarding the access of British parents to their dual-nationality children living in another country, had arranged to see Mr Eggar at 3 pm this afternoon with Mrs Ward and the two French women who are also on hunger strike.

The French women and all their belongings were thrown out of Heathrow at about 4 pm yesterday while Mrs Ward was elsewhere, being interviewed by Thames Television. When she returned, the women had gone — and although she remained alone until midnight, all her luggage had gone with them, and she could not cope without it.

The women have now based themselves in London with Lucy Jaffe, the English woman who is trying to form an association of British Mothers of Abducted Children.

On Saturday a JEP reporter and photographer flew to Heathrow to interview Mrs Ward. Their report is on pages 14 and 15.

JEWELLERY valued at £8,750 stolen during a break-in at Villa Capri, Mont-de-St-Anastase, St Peter, last Tuesday, has been recovered, the Police Court heard today.

Liverpudlian Paul David Skelthorn (21) reserved his plea to the charges, and was granted legal aid and remanded in custody until 10 April.

Top BAFTA awards for Rock and Tumbledown

TWO of TV's most controversial programmes, the documentary *Death on the Rock* and the drama *Tumbledown*, have walked off with British Oscars.

Thames TV's *Death on the Rock*, about the shooting of three IRA terrorists by the SAS in Gibraltar, went out despite attempts by the Government to stop it.

Tumbledown, BBC's dramatised story of Lt Robert Lawrence, who suffered terrible injuries in the Falklands battle, was only broadcast after cuts.

Death on the Rock won the Flaherty documentary award when the British Academy of Film and Television Arts awards were presented in London last night.

Before it was shown to the nation, Foreign Secretary Sir Geoffrey Howe asked the IBA to ban it, saying it could prejudice the inquest — claims later echoed by Mrs Thatcher.

Thames later commissioned an independent inquiry headed by former Home Office Tory minister Lord Windlesham, who all but vindicated the programme.

Roger Bolton, editor of *This Week* Programme, which made *Death on the Rock*, commented: "One minute you think you are heading for the Tower and the next you get an award like this."

Tumbledown was named Best Single Drama. Colin First played Lt Lawrence, and cuts

were made in the play written by a soldier involved in the battle.

ITV and Channel 4 together picked up 10 TV Oscars, against five for the BBC.

Channel 4's drama series *A Very British Coup*, about the security services' efforts to oust a left-wing Labour Prime Minister, picked up three awards — Best Drama Serial and Best Actor for its star Ray McAnally, while Alan Plater, who created the series, took the writer's award.

Victoria Wood, who has her own series on the BBC, picked up two awards — but for her appearance on ITV.

An Audience with Victoria Wood from London Weekend Television was Best Light Entertainment Programme and was also the Best Light Entertainment Performance.

Channel 4's evening news was Best News or Outside Broadcast Coverage.

A Fish Called Wanda picked up two British film Oscars. John Cleese was voted best actor and his former Monty Python colleague, Michael Palin, best supporting actor.

The Jeremy Thomas-Bernardo Bertolucci production *The Last Emperor* was best film, and Louis Malle best director for *Au Revoir Les Enfants*.

Maggie Smith was best actress for her rôle in the *Lonely Passion of Judith Hearne*, and Judy Dench best supporting actress in *A Handful of Dust*.

M1 air accident report

Crash crew 'shut down good engine'

CREWMEN in the M1 air disaster were led to believe they had solved the emergency on their Boeing 737 by shutting down the right-hand side engine, it was disclosed today.

But this engine showed no evidence of anything wrong, a special bulletin issued by the Air Accident Investigation Branch showed, and it was the left-hand engine that showed evidence of fire damage.

Eventually power was completely lost on the left engine and the plane crashed short of East Midlands Airport at Kegworth in Leicestershire with a loss of 47 lives.

The bulletin said:

● The left engine showed evidence of fire damage.

● The right engine showed no evidence of pre-crash fire or failure.

● A fan blade in the left engine fractured due to "a progressive fatigue failure".

The report said the flight crew — Capt Kevin Hunt and First Officer David McLelland — experienced moderate to severe vibration, a burning smell and smoke 13 minutes into the flight from Heathrow to Belfast on 8

January.

They diagnosed this as indicating a problem in the right-hand engine which was shut down within two minutes and seven seconds.

The report said: "By that time power had been reduced on the left engine, which continued to operate at comparatively low power."

The report added: "After the accident the commander (Captain Hunt) stated that during the remainder of the descent the indications from the engine instruments were such as to confirm that the emergency had been successfully concluded and that the left engine was operating normally."

Eighteen minutes after the first problem, the left engine lost power and Capt Hunt told

Mr McLelland to restart the right engine, said the report.

Seventeen seconds after this power loss, the fire warning system operated on the left engine. No power became available from the right engine before the aircraft struck the ground.

The AAIB said the bulletin "must necessarily be regarded as tentative and subject to alteration or correction if additional evidence becomes available".

It added: "The bulletin is not an accident report, either final or interim. Nothing is to be taken as a final statement of the facts and circumstances of the accident nor would it be right to draw any conclusions from it as to the cause(s) of the accident."

Crackdown urged on tit-for-tat murderers

THE Government was urged today to take the shackles off the security forces in Northern Ireland following the latest tit-for-tat sectarian killing.

Mr Cecil Walker, Unionist MP for North Belfast — scene of the latest murder — said police and troops should be enabled to do whatever necessary to remove the killers.

He spoke out after terrorism claimed its tenth victim in just 12 days. Catholic David Braniff, (63), was shot dead last night as he knelt in the kitchen of his Alliance Avenue home praying with his wife.

Gunmen burst in through the front door and opened fire at point blank range. They pumped numerous bullets into Mr Braniff despite his wife flinging herself across his prone body in an effort to shield him.

Mr Braniff, a father of 13 children, was rushed to hospital, still clutching his rosary beads but died on the way.

A car used by the killers had been hijacked a short time earlier in the loyalist Shankill Road area and was found abandoned a few streets away after the killing.

Loyalists have been responsible for nine of the 24 terrorist-related killings in Northern Ireland this year. Last Thursday the IRA shot dead former UVF leader Jackie Irvine in his home. In response two innocent Catholics have now been murdered.

The security forces and the Government have become increasingly concerned about the spiral of sectarian killings this year.

The RUC chief constable Sir John Hermon said in his annual report last week that the particular concern was about the level of Loyalist paramilitary activity.

He said they had stockpiled quantities of modern weaponry which they were prepared to use.

SDLP spokesman Mr Brian Feeney claimed today that Mr Braniff's killers had tried to shoot him two weeks ago.

El Salvador poll deaths

A right-wing millionaire tentatively claimed victory in El Salvador's presidential elections yesterday in which dozens of people were reported killed as leftist guerrillas clashed with security forces.

Three journalists, including a Dutch television cameraman, were among the dead.

Alfredo Cristiani, presidential candidate of the Nationalist

Republican Alliance (ARENA), said his party's unofficial count of 75 per cent of the vote cast showed he was winning with 54 per cent.

ARENA has been linked to rightist death squads and promises strong measures to end a nine-year war in which 70,000 people have died.

Cristiani said he would be open to negotiations with the guerrillas.

Everyone loves Boris

BORIS Yeltsin, cheered by thousands of Muscovites but under investigation by the ruling Communist Party, has emerged as the focal point in next Sunday's multi-candidate Soviet elections.

Some 7,000 protesters marched through the centre of Moscow yesterday to back the disgraced former Moscow Party chief and junior Politburo member — the first such demonstration in the capital since the late 1920s.

On Saturday, a similar crowd outside a suburban supermarket roared approval when Yeltsin denounced the Commission set up last week by the Party's Central Committee to probe allegations that he had deviated from the Party line during the campaign.

IN BRIEF

French Socialists batter the Right

THE French Right was licking its wounds today after seeing up to 15 big cities fall into the hands of President Francois Mitterrand's governing Socialist Party.

First results in the second, conclusive round of municipal elections showed that in spite of a rash of public sector strikes, the Socialists had wrested control of crucial centres such as Strasbourg, Aix-en-Provence, Dunkirk, Avignon, Brest and Orleans.

The Right had dominated France's town halls ever since the last elections in 1983, when dissatisfaction with Mitterrand's socialist presidency was at its height.

PLO talks urged

DEPUTY finance minister Yossi Beilin called today for talks with the banned PLO even if Israel's coalition government fell as a result.

Labour's Minister Without Portfolio, Ezer Weizman, has also called for negotiations with the PLO.

"The time has come to get up and say the partner is the PLO if it will cease violence," Yossi Beilin, a top aide of Labour party chief Shimon Peres, said on Israeli radio.

"We must tell ourselves and the world that today there is no one else. We must set up conditions, the PLO must meet those conditions, and then we will meet them," he said.

'Green Line' fury

MORE than 3,000 women demonstrators stormed the Cyprus "Green Line" yesterday in protest against the 14-year division of the Mediterranean island.

Fifty-four women were arrested as the two-pronged Greek-Cypriot assault was met by angry Turkish-Cypriot demonstrators shouting "Go Home".

The Greek-Cypriots were joined by supporters from the United States, Europe and Australia. Among them was Margaret Papandreou, estranged wife of Greek Prime Minister Andreas Papandreou.

Boat blaze death

A man was killed when fire swept a cabin cruiser moored at Acle Bridge near Great Yarmouth early today.

He was trapped on board as flames engulfed the vessel. Norfolk fire service and police were trying to find out how the fire started.

Bombing admitted

A Welsh extremist group has admitted a fire bomb attack on an estate agent's office in Stockport, Greater Manchester.

The incendiary device was discovered late last night following similar attacks on estate agencies in London, Liverpool and Sutton Coldfield during the weekend.

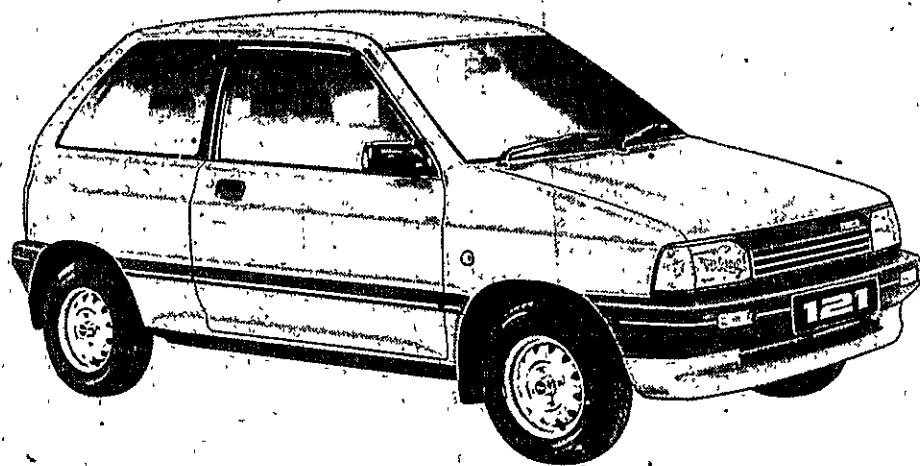
Greater Manchester police said the extremist group Sons of Glendower had claimed to have planted the device.



Local authorities on alert as poison search goes on

JERSEY authorities were on alert today as the search continued off Alderney for a container of lethal insecticide which threatens, 'an environmental disaster' in the Channel.

An emergency meeting of representatives of the Defence, Agricultural and Fisheries Committees, and Civil Emergency Office, was called at the Bailiff's office this morning to assess the potential risks to the Island's fishing industry and environment.

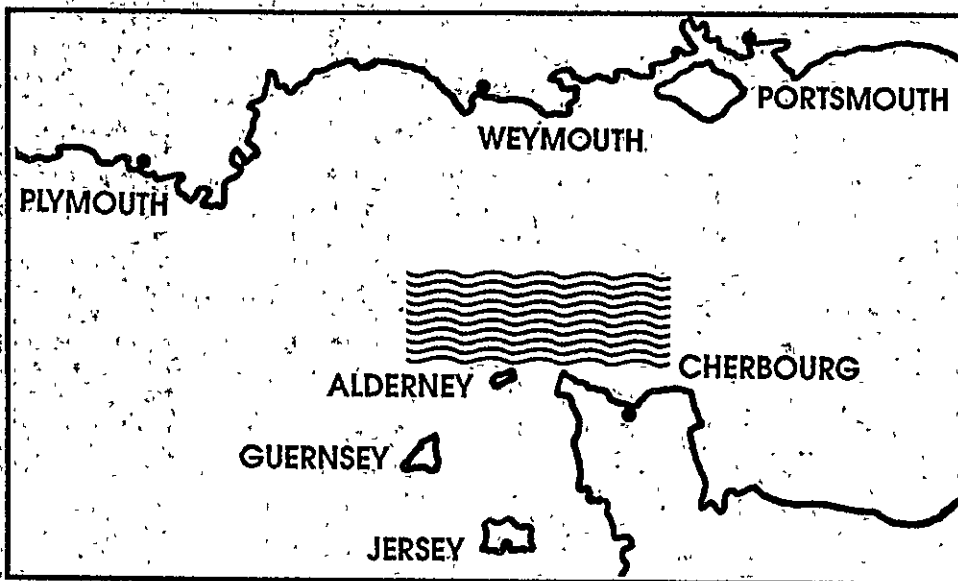
Local water and fish samples are to be analysed, and the results of tests on water samples from the area, taken by the UK authorities, were expected later today.

Meanwhile, two French naval minesweepers with sonar search facilities were searching an area ten to 15 miles north north-west of Alderney in a desperate bid to find the 40-ft container, which holds enough of the insecticide, Lindane, to pollute most of the Channel.

Even in minute quantities, the chemical is lethal to fish stocks and once in the food chain it would remain there for ever.

The container, recovered last Wednesday after being lost on Monday from the sunken Indonesian ship, Perintine, was under tow by a French warship when it broke free and sank in 50 metres of water about ten miles north of Cap de la Hague yesterday.

Jersey's Defence Committee vice-president, Deputy Mike Wavell, has already expressed

concern at how this happened and at the transportation of such dangerous chemicals close to Channel Islands waters.

Agriculture and Fisheries were standing by to move all local fishing vessels from the area, if waters were found to be polluted, he added.

CI Air Search, Aurigny and Air Sarnia have been among aircraft involved in the massive air-and-sea search operation, co-ordinated by the French authorities, although these services were not called upon today.

The container holds six tons of the deadly chemical, which is packed in polythene bags in blue fibre-board drums.

The environment group

Greenpeace say that it would be "an environmental disaster" if the chemical is released.

A spokesman told the JEP this morning that even in minute quantities it was lethal to fish stocks and other marine life and it could cause cancer, birth defects and a type of anaemia in humans.

It has been estimated that 1,500 cu kilometres of water—a large part of the English Channel—would be needed to dilute the chemical to what are considered safe amounts.

"It is ludicrous that a ship this small, carrying such a large container of Lindane, a chemical which has been banned in many parts of the world," the Greenpeace spokesman said.

This morning, sea fisheries officer Dr Simon Bossy was monitoring tidal current flows and the potential effects on Jersey's fishing industry, although he said that the Island was a good 60k from the point where the container disappeared.

The Jersey and other CI authorities are continuing to keep in touch with the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, who were hoping to have the results of tests on water samples later today to establish whether any of the chemical had leaked.

Although its use is banned or severely restricted in many countries, Lindane is used in wood preservatives in the UK, with Ministry of Agriculture approval.

Tourism hope for central bookings system by 1991

JERSEY should have a central reservations system in operation by 1991 if plans currently being considered by Tourism come to fruition.

The Tourism Committee have agreed that the department should employ consultants experienced in travel-trade technology to advise on the type of central reservations system which would work for Jersey.

Tourism director Mrs Sheila Henwood has asked London-based marketing consultant Mr Miles Quest to earmark a number of companies who will be considered as the consultants to carry out the report for the Island, estimated to cost between £10,000 and £20,000.

According to Mrs Henwood, technology in the travel industry has really taken off in the last few years and Jersey has a lot to do to keep up with current booking standards.

If UK travel agents have difficulty finding a local hotel

for their clients, they may well decide to dissuade them from coming here, she believes.

"In fact, recently, someone from our advertising agency overheard an agent dissuading someone from booking a holiday in the Island," she said.

If it is easier to book a holiday elsewhere than in Jersey, then that is a negative situation, she said.

Undoubtedly visitors love Jersey but it is important to make it easy for people to book a holiday here, she added.

A central reservations system would be particularly useful for dealing with advance bookings and for those people who arrived here without a reservation, who could be made aware at once what was available.

Fishing boat wrecked

A 21-ft fishing boat was wrecked when its propeller became fouled on rope and it drifted on to rocks near Ichô Tower yesterday morning.

The boat, belonging to fisherman Mr R J Le Brun, of Maufant, St Saviour, was holed fore and aft and was left high and dry as the tide receded.

The Fire Service inshore rescue craft stood by, but Mr Le Brun, who was in no danger, decided to stay on the vessel and attempt to refloat it when the tide returned.

At 1.30 pm the States tug the Duchess was sent out to try to tow it off on the high tide, but it had been badly holed by the rocks, and the swell had caused it to fill with water.

Mr Le Brun had been taken off the boat and had managed to save most of the equipment on board.

One mail delivery 'fairest'

AN Island-wide, single daily delivery is the fairest and most effective use of postal resources, say the administering committee.

In a note to States Members on the forthcoming major review of postal services, now made public, the Postal Committee have confirmed that they plan to do away with the second delivery in the town areas, where it still exists.

They argue that on average this delivery carries only four per cent or less of the mail and that staff can be better deployed.

The changes to the system are to be brought in next month, say Postal, and once these have settled down, deliveries should, in normal circumstances, have been completed by 1 pm and within the St Helier Ring Road, by 11 am.

Collections, they say, should be such that all mail is sorted for outward despatch on the same day, or local delivery the following morning.

The Sunday collection will be maintained, as will the facility for posting late in the day or overnight before the first collection the next day at Broad Street and Mont Millais to connect with

the local morning delivery.

Postal say that the main reason for the review, which has involved many months of work, is a substantial increase in letter mail.

The present reorganisation, they go on, had to accommodate four major complications.

The first was a 30 per cent increase in letter mail between 1986 and last year; the second, the replacement by the British Post Office of the 5.45 am mail arrival by later arrivals; the third, staff shortages, 'unrest' and the UK postal strike; and the fourth, the virtual embargo on staff increases in Jersey because of the States manpower restraints.

But the approval of a restricted level of staff increases by the Establishment Committee and the reintroduction of an early mail delivery service, which was expected to continue, paved the way for the review.

This, say Postal, involves methods of mail-handling, and the reorganisation of deliveries, with additional rounds and some new collection times.

I shall be issuing a press release on 22nd March and orders will be accepted from Tuesday 28th March.

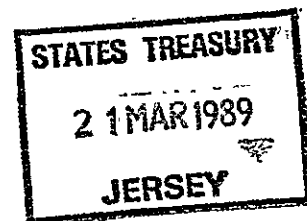



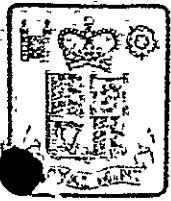

Further to my letter dated 9 March, I am now replying to the outstanding points from your letter dated 23 February.

Minting Limits

We have noted your decision of a 3000 issue limit for the silver proofs, including a Royal Mint allocation of 1500. This figure is likely to be lower than that fixed for the other Royal Visit coins, but we do not see this as too much of a problem.

Royalty

Our proposal to pay a royalty of 15% of the retail price, that is £3.75 on the agreed price of £25 takes account of the budget we would like to follow for promoting this issue. An increase in royalty to £4.50 would significantly reduce the promotional budget. Having regard to the figures, we would suggest a compromise to a royalty of £4, which was the figure agreed for the 1985 Liberation issue silver proofs. I trust that it will be possible to agree this revised figure.

ROYAL VISIT COMMEMORATIVE COINS

Thank you for your letter, dated 6 and 10 February about the issue of £2 coins commemorating the visit of The Queen and Prince Philip on 25 May.

Design

We note that the obverse will show the Maklouf effigy with the date 1989. The design will therefore be exactly as appeared on your 1985 Liberation issue, except for the change in date.

Our artist has examined your draft design and his suggestions for making best use of the available space are enclosed. The designs are lettered A and B for ease of identification. For technical reasons it is highly desirable to fill out the centre of the design, and we suggest that this be best accomplished by inserting an outline of the island behind the mace. We should appreciate your comments on his design as soon as possible, in order that our artist may proceed with the preparation of his relief plaster model.

Minting Limit

We confirm that the Royal Mint would be honoured to sell £2 silver proofs on your behalf, and we would wish to receive a minimum allocation of 1250 pieces. Given the proposal to limit the silver proof coins to a maximum quantity of 2500 and your procedure for accepting orders over a four week period, we are concerned that your own orders might encroach upon the Royal Mint allocation. In our view, an issue of the importance of a Royal Visit, would merit fixing the issue limit at 5000 pieces, which would include a Royal Mint allocation of 1500. Whilst we could not guarantee that an issue limit of 5000 would sell out, we should anticipate that the combined demand on the Island and from Royal Mint customers would exceed 2500 pieces.

Retail Price

We recommend that the £2 silver proofs retail at £25 excluding VAT. This is the current price for silver proof crowns, and I trust that it is in line with your own thoughts.

Delivery

I confirm that we anticipate being able to comply with your delivery programme, assuming of course that the design proceeds on the present basis.

Quotation

I should be writing again in the next few days with our quotation for the silver proof and the cupro-nickel circulation standard coins.

GUERNSEY AND JERSEY ROYAL VISIT COINS

1. GUernsey Royal Visit

I would recommend the selling price for the Guernsey Royal Visit Silver Proof crowns to be £27.50 (inc VAT), £23.91 (exc VAT). The initial requirements for all Marketing areas would be 1500 pieces.

We are currently considering the issue of a Guernsey PNC, but would like your confirmation that in respect of any PNCs unsold, Guernsey would be prepared to refund the value of the postage stamp. On the assumption that this refund will be applicable, I would estimate the selling price of a PNC to be £5.50 (inc VAT), £4.78 (exc VAT). You have not indicated whether the arrangements for PNCs would be the same as previous, ie the Royal Mint take the risk in the production and Guernsey buy the PNCs back from the Royal Mint at trade prices. It would be appreciated, in this situation, if Guernsey could indicate their interest in the quantity of PNCs they might wish to purchase.

2. Promotion

The most appropriate vehicle for promotion would appear to be the May Bulletin. Unfortunately, because of the restriction by Jersey (see below) on the availability of their coin, it will not be possible to promote the Jersey and Guernsey coins earlier than May.

3. Jersey Royal Visit coins

The first problem with your proposal of 14 February concerning Jersey Royal Visit coins is the low issue limit. It is probable that we would require approximately 1250 pieces at a minimum. If this quantity cannot be guaranteed, then the benefits of promotional expenditure associated with the problems of unsatisfied customers makes it less worthwhile to undertake a full promotion. For such an event I see little to be gained in having such a small issue limit, and I would have thought, like Guernsey, their issue limit could have been increased to 10,000. I would suspect that for an important visit of this nature, 2500 pieces would be sold in Jersey alone.

Assuming we can obtain sufficient pieces, I would recommend selling prices to be the same as Guernsey, indicated above. Unfortunately, the timetable indicated in your memo of 14 February precludes the combined promotion of a Guernsey and Jersey coin, as the Jersey coins aren't being issued until 22 May.

4. Alderney

There might be some advantage in marketing all three issues as a combined promotion brochure if the availability of the Jersey coin could be given to the Royal Mint before 22 May. In this

instance, I would consider promoting Guernsey, Jersey and Alderney in an individual brochure early in April. If this is possible, I would appreciate it if you could let me know the issue limits and prices of the Alderney coins.



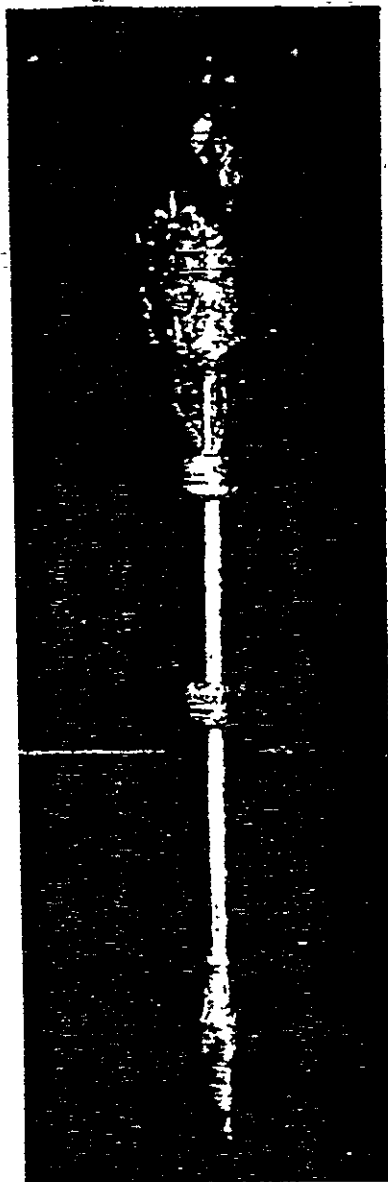

THE ROYAL MACE OF THE BAILIFF OF JERSEY

The Royal Mace of the Bailiff of Jersey, borne before the Bailiff at the sittings of the Royal Court and of the Assembly of the States of Jersey, was presented by King Charles II to Jersey on the 28th November 1663 in gratitude for the hospitality which he received from the Island on two occasions during his years of exile.

The Jersey Mace is one of the great maces of the seventeenth century, and consists of eleven separate pieces. It is of silver gilt, 4ft. 9½ins. long; actually weighs 237 ounces, and has no hall marks, only 237.5.0 marked on the pendant. It was ordered, as appears in "The Book of Warrants of the Lord Chamberlain, Edward, Earl of Manchester, of His Majesty's Household, entered under date 31st July, 1663" by a Warrant to prepare and deliver to "The Bailiff of Jersey a silver mace gilt of 200 ounces".
