



Further to our recent telephone conversation I have investigated the matter of the royalty statement concerning the Jersey 'tickler' silver proof coin issues.

I have discussed the matter with my finance colleagues and they advise me that the total issues of silver proof coins 2,560 is overstated by ten pieces. This error has occurred due to the Royal Mint Marketing Department acting as go-between in dealings between two coin dealers. One dealer had ten such coins and the other dealer required them and therefore the Royal Mint Marketing Department fulfilled the needs of the one from the stock of the other. In error therefore the sale of ten additional pieces has been shown where as in fact it was merely a transaction between two members of our dealer network.

I would ask you to please accept my apologies for the error and we in turn thank you for pointing out the problem to us. A revised statement will be prepared and sent to you shortly.

I have received a complaint this morning by telephone from Mr Le Marquand about the late delivery of the country requirement. The works order amendment number 7 called for delivery to the country on 29th August 1990 and my fax to Mrs Carter, copies Mr Hampson and Mr Calford dated 17th August concluded with the paragraph:

"Could Mr Calford please ensure the coins are available for despatch to Jersey on 29th August."

I followed this with a telephone call to Production Control on 28th August on return from Bank Holiday and another on 29th reminding your department of the delivery requirement. I was told that all the stops were being pulled out to ensure that delivery could take place on Friday. Mr Le Marquand had told his customers that despatches would take place on the week commencing 3rd September so that if we had made the Friday flight I am sure that no complaint would have been forthcoming.

When however I advised Mr Le Marquand today that the order would be leaving the UK on Tuesday, 4th September he was rather irate. He pointed out that this was nearly a week later than the promised delivery date and that he had further been embarrassed by an announcement on local radio that the coins could be collected from the States Treasury as from today 3rd September.

I have of course apologised to the customer for the late delivery but in accordance with the new procedure in force from today I do require a response to this complaint from your department.

Jersey Remembers The Battle of Britain

The Channel Island of Jersey a key World War II battlaground in the allied fight for liberty has joined in the Battle of Britain 50th Anniversary celebrations. Situated approximately 100 miles off the south coast of England, Jersey suffered five long years of occupation by Hitler's troops, and serves as a stark reminder of what might have been on mainland Britain but for the courageous defence by the allied airmen of the RAF.







Neither myself nor Production Control seem to be getting anywhere.

There are several aspects of this issue which are now giving cause for concern. These are as follows:

DESIGNS

In a conversation today with Mr Elsasser, it became apparent that he was unaware that there were two designs for the Jersey Battle of Britain coins. He had received, and was working on the design for the £100, £50, £5 and £2 coins, but had no knowledge or information on the second design to be used in the 4-coin gold Set on the £25 and £10 denominations.

ORDER FOR BLANKS

Production Control is still awaiting approval to order 999 gold blanks from an outside supplier. They apparently have had no reply to their fax of 2 May and have followed this up with a fax of 21 May. Lead time from outside supplier is currently 6-8 weeks and it would appear that precious time is being lost.

PACKING MATERIAL

Production Control are also anxious to order packing material and my fax to Mr Chapman of 25 April asks for specific quantities to be included on the Works Order for Marketing requirements. This would have enabled packing material to be ordered from that date but, as this has not yet been done, further delays are possible. My memo of 25 April has been followed up by a reminder of 22 May.

Marketing are extremely anxious to obtain coins for photography in order that we can prepare promotional material in time to get to our customers for mid-August. I was also hoping to be able to take Jersey 4-coin gold sets to the ANA at Seattle and the CNA at Vancouver the week before.

It will be a pity if, because of delays in completing appropriate paperwork, the marketing opportunities presented by the issue of a Battle of Britain coin from Jersey are missed.

Further to your fax of 4 June and our discussions of the same date, there are a couple of points with this issue still causing me some concern.

- You suggested in your paragraph headed Packing Materials that the Royal Mint Marketing department will be unaware of the quantity of coins available to them for marketing until Jersey themselves have closed their subscription list on 13 August. We cannot prepare marketing plans: and programmes on the basis of selling the 'left-overs' from Jersey's allocation. 



We can agree the royalties as set out in your letter of 6th March i.e., 10% on the UK selling price of the gold sets and 12% on the UK selling price of the large silver piece. We are prepared to agree to the £4.00 royalty based on the small silver proof as requested.

5. Mintage Levels

I note from your letter of 6th March that you agree to the limit of 500 gold sets and 5,000 of the large silver as per our recommendation. With regard to the small silver proof piece we still believe that a limit of 10,000 would be realistic and would ask you to re-consider your suggested limit of 5,000. Preliminary indications from our Marketing Department suggest this "one off" issue will prove very popular and they are anxious to have sufficient coins available to meet likely demand.

6. Discount Structure

As mentioned in Mr Lotherington's fax dated 9th February 1990 we would supply sets/coins for sale in Jersey at cost price, based on the costs set out above subject to the bullion price variation in the usual way.

7. Firm Selling Prices

Subject to no significant variation in bullion costs between now and the date of the issue the prices to the general public will be £900 for the gold set, £70 for the large silver piece and £25 for the small silver piece, all plus VAT.

I trust that the foregoing satisfies your queries and look forward to receiving the decision of the Finance Economic Committee in due course.



Jersey again best fund-raisers in the world

Air display not threatened by Guernsey Tourism decision

GUERNSEY'S Tourist Board have said that they will not be financially supporting the annual Battle of Britain Week air displays for at least the next three years.

The announcement was made in Guernsey yesterday - the day the Jersey branch of the Royal Air Forces Association received the Judd and Hope Trophies as the top fundraisers in the world.

But Guernsey's RAFA were also told that if the level of private sponsorship dropped to such an extent that the display could not be financed, the Board would reconsider their decision.

In Jersey, the Tourism Committee have already authorised a grant of £11,500, the same amount as last year, for the 50th anniversary year of the Battle of Britain, and are considering a small increase.

Mr Roger Le Monnier, Tourism's European Marketing manager, said that although they were in favour of commercial sponsorship for the event, it was one traditionally supported by the committee and they would continue to make the grant, although the grants were not 'inflation-proof'.

The Guernscy display has been sponsored for about half of its cost by a company called Transglobe, who have committed themselves

for a further three years.

The president of the RAFA Jersey branch, Grp Capt Richard Green, said that he wasvery disappointed to hear the news from Guernsey, and that the loss of funds would be a blow.

'However, this will not affect the event, which will take place as it has every year since the war,' he said.

'Jersey's Battle of Britain Week air display is known all over the world, and has been featured in foreign magazines many times,' he said.

We have a considerable amount of commercial sponsorship, and we sell advertisements in the souvenir programme to help as much as possible with the costs, as well as getting a good deal on insurance with a charge of £2,000 to cover the event.

'We cover at least half of the cost, and hope to cover more.'

According to the Group Captain, even if Guernsey dropped out of the event completely, Jersey could continue alone as the major fund-raiser in the world.

'It is of concern because we work very closely with Guernsey, but they only have a display as an extension of the Jersey event, because their airfield is too small,' he said.

However, he warned that the Guernsey.


contribution to the overall costs was very valuable, and the Jersey branch would have to look very closely at the costs if the Guernsey event should founder.

Last year, despite the very poor weather, Jersey managed to raise enough to cover the costs and send £25,000 to Service charities, and win the RAFA fund-raising trophies against competition from the other 670 associations in the world.

This year they are making a special effort for the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Britain, and Grp'Capt Green warned that over the 'next ten years the numbers of those needing the association's help would reach a peak.

The Jersey branch's achievement in becoming the top fund-raising branch for the 36th year in succession was announced by the president, Mr Sam Senett, at its annual dinner last night, when tribute was paid to the branch by the national vice-president and chairman of the RAFA executive committee, Air Vice-Marshal Bill Bailey.

I refer to the facsimile dated 9th February 1990 from Mr Lotherington inviting the States of Jersey to participate in the issue of gold and silver coins to commemorate the 50th anniversary of the Battle of Britain and would advise you that the invitation has been accepted, in principle, by the Finance and Economics Committee.

I have been asked to submit the proposed designs as soon as possible. Assumming that designs will be accepted, would you kindly seek Home Office approval to the issues of these coins by the States of Jersey.

DESIGN AND TOOLWORK

It is noted that all costs involved would be met by the Royal Mint.

QUANTITIES

The limit of 500 gold sets is acceptable and I wish to recommend a limit of 5000 in both versions of the silver coin. A cupro nickel circulation coin will not be issued on this occasion.

ROYALTIES

The royalty payment of ten per cent on the UK selling price of the gold sets and 12 1/2% in the case of the 65mm silver coin is accepted. A royalty of £4 on the £2 silver coin is requested. This figure has been paid on previous silver coins with a selling price of £25.



SELLING PRICES/DISCOUNTS ETC

I have noted the proposed selling prices but would be pleased to know actuals as soon as the decisions are taken. It will be necessary to discuss trade discounts to ensure uniformnity. Also the States of Jersey will not be restricted to selling to residents only. All collectors on our mailing list will be given equal opportunity to purchase direct from the States Treasury.

BATTLE OF BRITAIN COINS - JERSEY AND GUERNSEY

We discussed at the recent Corporate Plan Conference the possibility of Jersey and cuernoey progressing the 1000 for Bullia of Britain coins. As Guernsey appear, at the moment, more positive, we agreed that the suggestions I had put forward in my memo of 9 February should relate to Guernsey's coins rather than Jersey.

To recap, therefore, the proposal is as follows:

1. GUERNSEY

I recommend an issue of a silver proof crown, limit 10,000.

- 2. 65mm, 5oz, 999 silver proof, issue limit 5,000.
- 3. A 4-coin gold set (999 gold) containing a loz, 20z, 20z and 1/10oz piece. The issue limit recommended is 500, although this would depend on the quantity of 4-coin sets required by the country. The designs I would recommend offering to Guernsey are the two Leslie Durbin designs, Nos 8 and 25 (see attached fax). Design 8 should be used for the two silver pieces and two of the coins in the gold set. Design 25 should be used for the remaining two coins in the gold set.

As far as the two designs are concerned, I would recommend omitting the words 'Winston Churchill' as this would give more space for the actual quote to be illustrated.

JERSEY

As far as the Jersey proposal is concerned, the issues, issue limits and alloys to be recommended are the same as for Guernsey above.

The design I would suggest for Jersey would be Designer G, (Ian Rank-Broadley), Design No 1 to be used on the two silver coins and two of the gold coins. The choice of design for the second gold coin could either by Designer G, Design No 2, or Designer A, Design No 19. The latter alternative would then maintain some continuity and style between the Jersey and Guernsey sets.

Would you please let me know if there is any more information you require.


If Designs 8 and 25 are accepted for Guernsey, then it will probably be necessary to have the full Winston Churchill quotation repeated on Design 25. It might be more appropriate for Design 25 to have reference to the 50th Anniversary of the Battle of Britain. This will probably also leave room for denominational value on the reverse. To incorporate denominational value on Design 8 it may be necessary to restrict the quotation to 'So much owed by so many to so few', leaving space at the base of the design for the coin value.



- i. I recommend an issue of a silver proof crown, issue limit 10,000.
- ii. 65mm, 5oz, 999 silver proof, issue limit 5,000.
- iii. A 999 gold 4-coin set (loz, %oz, %oz, l/looz,) issue limit 500 (although this would depend on the quantity of 4-coin sets required by the country).

From designs which were submitted for the Battle of Britain medallion competition I would recommend for Jersey designer A's selection, numbers 8 or 9 (depending on Jersey's preference) to be used on the silver proof crown; 65mm coin and two of the gold designs. In addition to this design number 25 should be offered for the other two gold reverses.

I would recommend that the quote by Winston Churchill remain on the reverses, but that the words 'Winston Churchill' be omitted. This will provide more room for the quote to be shown on the coin and as it is so well-known, it is unnecessary to attribute it to Churchill.

I am aware from Graham Dyer that Designer A is Leslie Durbin, and it appears that he is normally quite happy for his designs to be modelled by the Royal Mint.
