Jersey.

The new Jersey copper coinage was put into circulation in that island on Saturday last. It consists of penny and half-penny pieces, and is to the amount of one thousand pounds. The obverse side of which bears a beautifully executed likeness of her Majesty, surrounded by the inscription of "Victoria D. G. Britanniar: Regina F. D. 1841." The reverse consist, of a shield bearing three leopards — *passant et gardant* — surrounded by the words. "STATES OF JERSEY, 1-13 (or 1-26) OF A SHILLING." The coins are very creditable specimens of art, and are in that respect much superior to those of Guernsey.
