ENGLISH COINAGE IN JERSEY.

For some years past efforts have been made to abolish the old currency system in the island of Jersey, but without success. The inconvenience of having two currencies — English and Jersey — has, however, been so strongly felt by tradesmen, that at the beginning of the year a large number resolved in future to sell their goods for English currency only. An attempt to aid the movement has now been made by the St Helier and St Aubin Railway Company, who have announced that from Wednesday no Jersey coppers will be either given or taken at any of the stations on that railway.
