Jersey Coppers v. the Jersey Railway Company.

On and after the 20th instant, the Jersey Railway Company will refuse Jersey coppers at their several stations, the object of the company being apparently to introduce the British currency in the island. Persons, therefore, who are obliged to change a sixpence at St. Helier's station to pay for a ticket to ride as far as the First Tower will, by this arrangement, pay 2 ½, instead of 2d. as heretofore.
