Jersey Copper.

A contemporary says that the States Harbour workmen are paid in British currency, and it is also generally known that a large quantity of copper coin is paid away wages to the men every week; but it will perhaps be scarcely credited when we assert that the States, or those persons who are employed by the Harbour Committee pay the workmen, which is about the same thing, actually ran over the town collecting all the Jersey copper they can at the end of the week, in some instances to the amount of £3 or £4 worth demanding 13d to the shilling, and pay away the same to the hands employed on the works at the rate of 12d to the shilling.
