GUERNSEY COPPER CURRENCY

We, *Jersey Express*, have been requested, owing to the quantity of Guernsey copper in circulation in the island, to caution the public against taking it. Certain persons are assiduously attempting to pass this coin on the plausible plea that it is "good, and of more value than Jersey copper!" In a few weeks' time the public will be seriously inconvenienced by these same persons; and unprincipled tradesmen will refuse to take Guernsey copper on the pretense that it is not British currency, after having thrown it broadcast among the public. We therefore advise the public to check the evil before it becomes a nuisance. Tradesmen can obtain English or Jersey copper for the asking, until the new coins enter into circulation.
